

The Diaconate Formation Program supports the vocation and ministry of the deacon, beginning as an Inquirer through his journey to ordination and beyond. The Diocese of Bridgeport provides an integrated four and one-half year program that is structured around the four pillars of human, spiritual, academic, and pastoral dimensions – all supported through gifts to the Annual Catholic Appeal.

Through prayer, study, and the grace of the Holy Spirit, the candidate undergoes a transformation of heart and mind as he prepares himself to be minister of the Word, Altar, and Charity. There are now 52 active deacons, 39 retired, most who continue to serve, and 8 men in formation. Our discussions with those interested in knowing more about our formation program is ongoing. When you give to the Annual Catholic Appeal, you support the formation of men who serve in our parishes and communities throughout the diocese for many years to come.

“Through the Annual Catholic Appeal, our men in formation are accompanied and supported, without the financial burden to fulfill their “call” to the diaconate. This allows the men to focus on their studies and discern their vocation in preparation for supporting their assigned parishes upon ordination.”


God our heavenly Father,

O Most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Mercy, at this most critical time, we entrust the United States of America to your loving care.



NOTICE TO ALL VIRTUS TRAINED VOLUNTEERS

SAFE ENVIRONMENT/VIRTUS TRAINING: In the Diocese of Bridgeport, the Safe Environment program and victim assistance ministry has been in place since 2003 and the Diocese has shown great leadership in the areas of child abuse prevention, detection, early intervention, and outreach to survivors of sexual abuse.

In light of our sacred obligation to protect all of God's children, the Most Reverend Frank J. Caggiano, Bishop of Bridgeport, has issued updated guidelines and procedures for the 2020 Safe Environment Handbook. Safe Environment training and criminal background checks continue to be required of all clergy, employees, volunteers, tenants, vendors, and independent contractors in the Diocese of Bridgeport. These safeguards must be renewed every five or ten years based on a person's ministry. The Safe Environment Handbook is available online.

Earlier this year, Our Lady of Peace sent emails to volunteers whose email addresses we have on file. We asked that you visit the Diocese website (www.bridgeportdiocese.org) or Our Lady of Peace website (www.ourladyofpeacestratfordct.weconnect.com) to read the revised Safe Environment Handbook 2020, print and sign a copy of the Executive Summary Sheet for Lay Volunteers (page 72) and return a signed copy to the Parish Office.

In addition, the Diocese sent notification to certain volunteers to update their Virtus account. To update your account, log on to virtusonline.com, enter your User ID and Password and follow the prompts.

Many volunteers have complied; unfortunately, many of you have not.

This year the Office of Safe Environment, in full compliance with the U.S.C.C.B. Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, is conducting a full audit of the Diocese of Bridgeport. Our Lady of Peace will be audited in the fall 2021. VIRTUS training, recertification, background checks, and Executive summary sheets are to be on file at the time of the audit.

Volunteers not in compliance with Virtus by May 31st will no longer be able to volunteer. Volunteers are very important to our parish so please comply with all of the guidelines. For parishioners who can no longer volunteer please notify the Parish Office.

For Virtus trained parishioners who do not have access to computers, please call the Parish Office 203-377-4863 ext 10 and leave a message for Maryann our Virtus Coordinator and she will return your call.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. Let us work towards making Our Lady of Peace 100% compliant at time of audit!

GOSPEL MEDITATION-ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE-6TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

"Remain in my love," and, "I call you friends," are powerful words that are found in John's Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open up new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning. The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

Where does love come from? We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our "failures in love." In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, its success and also its failure. While our weakness, emotional composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human. God is love. God is love's author and origin. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness that Jesus is able to call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God's love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open up avenues for true justice. Understanding this profound truth will also help us find peaceful solutions to world's problems, restore relationships with our sisters and brothers, bring the grace of loving stewardship to creation and heal many wounds. Once we begin to see how wonderfully holy all of life really is, we discover joy. We lose our need for fear, develop a fierce fortitude, act prudently and seek justice. There is great power in love because it comes from God. It will never fail. It also enjoys the company of two other friends who are eager to become our friends as well: faith and hope. These are just as important to have and to share. ©LPi




