I write this week's column with two thoughts in mind:

First, we offer a warm welcome back home to Deacon Steven, who led a contingent of youth and adults on the annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. these past few days, participating in the Archdiocesan Pilgrimage with Cardinal Seán. We all look forward to hearing about this wonderful experience and seeing some pictures and video. It is inspiring to see so many young people throughout the Archdiocese and country witnessing to the value and dignity of all human life, as we pray for an end to the wound of abortion. A fuller lay staff will enhance our parish life, ministries and activities. That being said, our present offertory goal is more than achievable if everyone takes responsibility and does their part. Thank you for maintaining or even increasing your weekly offertory to Saint Joseph Parish: you parish needs your financial support!





The Pro-Life Rosary is prayed before the 9:30 am Mass every Sunday. Please join in prayer for respect for all life, especially pre-born babies.




