Friends:

It's been almost three months since my arrival here at our parish of Good Shepherd and St Christopher's and I must admit I already have a deep appreciation for the life and work of our combined parishes and the unique aspects of each. As he leaves, I know that I feel an immense gratitude to Father Crawford for his amazing dedication to the constant improvements to our facilities is a gift that I can stand back and thank God and him.

Usually, when a priest enters and begins to take over the day to day running of a parish, he has a bit more time and leisure to just take it in, learn, get to see "the whole year" before setting priorities. Man plans....God laughs – or so they say.

However, the circumstances of several realities: Father Crawford's transfer, Fr David's departure, the merger, effects of COVID on Mass attendance and the retirement of our religious education coordinator means I must make some decisions way faster than I'd like. Thankfully – I've had the chance to canvas many of our parishioners for their guidance and their dreams about what our parish can be in the years ahead. I plan on being here many years with you so the change and adaptations that Fr Pat and Fr Crawford had in their shared ministries here will settle down to a much more stable situation soon.

First, as someone who comes from Kingston – when the "merger" word comes from the Archdiocese my initial reaction is "uh oh..." and brace for closure. Thankfully that is not and will not be the case as we merge. Virtually nothing will change, each building, each church and chapel will remain and daily and Sunday Masses will remain intact. So, if that helps all of us breathe easier – you can count on that.

Secondly, for now I will be aided by a priest only on the weekends. One man – two simultaneous Masses won't work. I have spoken already to folks to ensure daily Mass at a convenient time for as many folks as possible. You'll see that Good Shepherd will have an early Mass and St Chris a mid-day one.

Third, Ellen Farina our current director is retiring, and I'm thrilled to have Good Shepherd's able assistant Hillary Gaddis-Clegg coming on board as Director of our CCD program and new aftercare option. We'll also be shortening the program which will now include Mass attendance and an earlier grade for Confirmation as well as reaching out to "former families" – no more annoying every other week evening classes with service hours, family hours, and retreats. An aftercare option will also make it easier to lighten the load for folks too. Consistent Mass from families will also help our stability as a parish with fuller pews.....rather than just fuller desks.

Fourth, thank you.....thank you! Your serious generosity is amazing and is a significant sign of your love for the churches of our parish. When I tell priest friends of the number of people who come versus the collection, they are amazed. Please know that I want to honor your stewardship and be a careful guardian of your trust as well as your dollars. Especially now, with inflation, uncertainty and more know that it is appreciated in ways you cannot imagine.

Fifth, because having three churches (counting our historic chapel) is new to me and most priests, pray for me and our staff. I will promise to do all in my power to be at as much as humanly possible. I want to serve you as God would wish me to do....with energy, kindness and compassion. It will also take time for me to learn names, which Mass you go to, and your history in our parish – feel free to even send me a picture with a little bit about yourself so I can learn and pray for you.

I know this is a lot....for you and for me. At my old assignment I was used to 2,400 people at 7 weekend Masses they were all in one location on one campus so this merger and growing attendance will be a learning curve for us all. We'll probably all make mistakes, as we are all human, trust that I will own mine and trust that I will give you my all....at the hospital, nursing homes, charities, CCD, Masses, and parish events. I have appreciated your warm welcome and your prayers so far and will need them as we grow together these years ahead.

On the alternate page I've included the new schedules which will boost attendance at our beloved mission chapel, adapt to times at Mass which allow more priests and deacons to be present to you all and allows for our new weekend priest – Father Raj ---- - to serve all of us as well as I hope to.





SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Rita of Cascia | May 22



St. Rita of Cascia (1381 – 1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community. Born in centhe calling to become a nun, but was pres-

sured at a young age into marriage. During her 18year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status as a widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.

Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel. © LPi
