RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)... RCIA is the process of welcoming new members to the Catholic Church. It is intended for adults who have never been baptized or for adults who have been baptized Christian and now wish to practice the faith in the Catholic tradition. It is an ongoing process of formation, catechesis and liturgical rites. Anyone interested is asked to call the rectory to discuss the process.

PASTOR'S NOTE

“Master, to whom shall we go?...”

John 6:60-69

So, what was that “hard saying” (vs. 60) from the Bread of Life discourse of chapter 6 that prompted some to walk away from Jesus and no longer be his disciples?

“Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you...My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink...” (vss. 53ff).

Even without understanding how this could be so, Peter spoke up on behalf of the disciples who stayed and said, “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life” (vs. 68). It was a moment of decision. In a parallel situation, Joshua testified to the people, “As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord” (Joshua 24:15).

From the standpoint of the countrymen of Jesus, there were several reasons that the Bread of life teaching was a hard saying in the extreme. There was no Old Testament precedent for legitimately eating human flesh! Human beings were made in the image and likeness of God, wholly distinct from the animal kingdom (Genesis 1:26, 27). God gave to Noah and his descendants all flesh to eat (Genesis 9:3ff), but for any shedding of the blood of a human being, God would demand an accounting. Moreover, blood was considered to be the seat of life, to be revered, and not to be consumed. There are numerous Old Testament citations that the eating of human flesh, even in the circumstances of a severe famine, was considered an abomination and, where it happened, a horrible curse upon the people. Even more graphically, the Greek word to eat used here meant to “gnaw” or “chew on.” One can understand why many would have reacted viscerally with incomprehension to Jesus’ words.

Are there any possible Old Testament precedents that would at least have gotten people the slightest preparation for the real flesh and blood of Jesus as food? The simple answer is no. The notion of “transubstantiation,” which can help our feeble minds begin to grasp the mystery, was still a thousand years in the future. However, there are plenty of examples where the “appearance” of something changes but the “substance”—that which it is—remains the same in a way only God can do. Take for example, an angel appears as a human being and converses or wrestles (Genesis 32:23ff) with another. Or, an angel appears as a burning bush and speaks with Moses (Exodus 3:1ff). An invisible being becomes visible. Or, where Moses is “transfigured” by the radiance of divine glory (Exodus 34:29ff).

If God can make the appearances change, while the subject remains the same, why can’t God change the substance while the appearances and all the qualities of

the original remain the same—“transubstantiation”? In that way, the sacred food and drink of Holy Communion become palatable in the normal way of eating, and we really do receive Jesus thereby under the appearances of bread and wine. Isn’t it remarkable that for most of us, even for those who weren’t raised in the Catholic tradition, and without the explication of words such as these, baptismal grace does its thing and allows us to accept by faith the teaching of Jesus on the Bread of life?

Responded Peter, “We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.” (vs. 69) Lord, “your word is truth” (John 17:17). May the Spirit of God help all those who are continuing to struggle with his Eucharistic teaching!


