FUNDRAISING FOR HEATING SYSTEM

We will be signing a contract soon to install a new heat control system in the church. As previously mentioned, the old system was original to the church (over 60 yrs old) and no longer works. This is the reason we were not able to control the heat in the church last winter. As a result, we paid over \$7,000 for natural gas a month for at least two months. The new system will control both the heat and air conditioning in the church. It will be a programable system and will have sensors to monitor the outside air temperature. We need to raise \$20,000 for the system. We ask your assistance. Please mark all contributions "Heat System" if you make contributions at church or send a contribution through the mail. SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Monday, August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, a Holy Day of obligation. Masses will be celebrated at 7:30 AM and 7:00 PM. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

MISSIONARY APPEAL

Each year the Society for the Propagation of the Faith assigns a Missionary to speak at each of the parishes in our diocese in order to raise funds for their diocese or religious order. Father Peter Ayorogo from the Diocese of Bolgatango, Ghana will visit Sacred Heart and speak at each of the Masses on the weekend of August 20-21. There will be a second collection that weekend. You did not receive any envelopes for this special collection because it was assigned to us by the Propagation of the faith after the order for envelopes had been submitted. Movies and Memories


