FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Reflections from Fr. Stan

Dear Parish Family

Today we celebrate! Our annual Parish Festival is a unique opportunity to gather as one community of faith regardless of what worship site we regularly attend, or what Mass we might prefer. We join in a non-sacramental communion, sharing a meal, telling our stories, welcoming the old and the young, celebrating the many shades of color, the languages and cultures that remind us how diverse we are. We become the passage from the book of Revelation: "I looked and I saw a huger crowd, too huge to count. Everyone was there — all nations and tribes, all races and languages. And they were standing, waving palm branches before the Throne and the Lamb and heartily singing...All who were standing around the Throne — Angels, Elders, Animals — worshiped God!" (Revelation 7:9-12).

Since our festival last year we have had many moments to gather as a community of faith to worship and celebrate. We have welcomed the newly born, the newly baptized, lost and seeking, the skeptical and the committed believer. We have also said farewell to those whom God has called to Himself, to those who have followed God's voice to new homes and callings, to some programs and to cherished memories only to find the Lord inviting us to new life as new opportunities and missions call is to expand our vision of the reign of God.

Every day I see the posters in the worship sites and the rectory that have the simple message: "James:1:22." It is a reminder of what we are called to be — "Doers and Hearers of the Word."

Today our world and our society are painfully divided on lines of nation, tribe, people, and language. I sometimes see it in our own community when I encounter divisions of where we worship, how people speak about one another. John's vision of heaven seems so far away, James' desire that we be Doers and Hears seems like a dream, and as brothers and sisters of the Incarnate Word, we have to continue conforming our lives to His and Him to our lives.

Here is our reality: Our parish already spans the lines that divide so many in our world. We gather from virtually every nation, tribe, people and language to witness what it means to Hear the Word of God and Do what he tell us (See John 2:5).


We can work more on all this tomorrow. For today, let's just enjoy one another and the many blessings God has bestowed on us.




