



From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In the first place, let me wish each and every one of you a grace-filled Christmas, filled with the blessings of the Little Babe of Bethlehem! May you all experience the peace and joy that the birth of the Savior brings to us!

I would like to thank all those who have made the liturgy of these days so meaningful with their cooperation and support. Special 'Thanks' to Gail and her team and the Choir members for the melodious and prayerful Music for Christmas. Thank you to all the Lectors, Ushers, Eucharistic ministers, Ann (Sacristian) for their services and to Al for the livestreaming. We are specially indebted to all of you who came to decorate the church and to set up the nativity scene! May God bless you all!

One of the beautiful attractions of Christmas is the nativity scene in our churches and in hour homes. We do not get tired of lovingly looking at the baby Jesus lying in the 'manger'. Do you know that the word 'manger' comes from Latin root *mandere*, which means 'to chew' or 'to eat'? Manger was the place where food was given to the animals. It is in that manger that baby Jesus was laid, covered in swaddling clothes! He, who was to become food for us, was laid in the manger, even from his birth!

We do have the nativity scene in the church, just below the main altar. Baby Jesus is placed below the altar at the center. We come to adore him at the manger this Christmas. And we come to adore him on the altar at every Eucharist! We celebrate Jesus' birth in the manger at Christmas, once a year. But we celebrate the coming of the Lord on the altar, in the Eucharist every day! Jn 1:14 says: "The Word became flesh and pitched his tent among us!" This is what happens in all the tabernacles of the world – Jesus pitching his tent with us - to share our human nature, to share our life and to take our burdens upon himself! This is how Christmas and the Holy Eucharist are so mysteriously linked! As we contemplate the little baby in the manger, we are led to contemplate him, giving himself to us in the Eucharist.

Happy Birthday to you dear Jesus! Thank you, for pitching your tent among us!


