Deacon's Corner



This past October, Noreen and I had an opportunity to spend a weekend in a conference with the Diocese of Manchester, NH's deacons and their spouses at Church Landing in Meredith, NH. This weekend was led by the director of the deaconate for New Orleans, LA. We had the opportunity

to review and discuss the role of the diaconate and obedience to fulfilling our vocations as deacons and spouses. As with most meetings of this type, the participants not only enjoyed the program but more importantly the opportunity to reconnect with each other since we had not had an opportunity to come together for over a year due to the pandemic. I also had the opportunity to participate in a virtual online diaconate conference throughout this past November and view presentations by deacons, priests, and theologians from around the United States.

During my working years in the insurance industry, I was a member of and active in The Society of Insurance Trainers and Educators, as well as several other insurance professional organizations. Dear Parish Family,

Now that we have all celebrated Advent and Christmas, I pray this finds everyone well and more deeply centered in the Mystery of Jesus' Life. I am including some pictures of a Rosary Garden that I prayed in at the Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche in St. Augustine, Florida while I was visiting the Comunità Cenacolo America. I was able to pray at the shrine daily for a few weeks and I wanted you to see the images of Our Lady of La Leche and the Rosary Garden to help us pray together for the needs of our parish.

The shrine was established when Spanish settlers landed in St. Augustine, Florida in 1565 and said a Mass of Thanksgiving for their successful voyage. This is now known to be the first parish Mass in what is now the United States. It was also the beginning of a devotion to Our Lady of La Leche and the Infant Jesus which, in turn, led to the establishment of the first Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary in the United States.

This image of the Blessed Mother as Our Lady of La Leche here is from the small mission chapel on the beautiful property shared with the Rosary Garden. The walls of the Rosary Garden hold the names of children lost before birth. The Shrine property is called the "Sacred Acre" where pilgrims come from all over the world to pray for fertility, the health of their children, for safe delivery of those expecting and for healing of the grief of lost children.

It is a joy to announce that in our last Love for Life collection we received some monetary gifts to support the building of the Baby Garden in St. Joseph's Cemetery. The site has been set apart in the cemetery and already two families experiencing miscarriage have buried their babies in the garden. When we pray together on January 16^{th,} we will be at the site of the Baby Garden. It is Fr. Alan's hope to build a memorial wall around the garden for parents to place the names of children lost to miscarriage and abortion. It is our hope that this will become a place of healing and communion with the larger community to recognize the dignity of these children in their short time here with all of us.

I am not at all good at taking photos but here are the photos I took while praying in the Rosary Garden at the National Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche in St. Augustine. Maybe these will help us imagine our own Baby Garden here at Parish of the Holy Spirit and to begin to pray more intentionally for the health and well-being of our children and our families.

NOVENA FOR LIFE and ROSARY FOR LIFE

The protection of life is a sustained prayer intention of the Church, and in particular of the Knights of Columbus. To commemorate and bolster this important cause, the Knights have organized a pro-life event to include a novena, nine days of sustained prayer to build up a culture of life in our parishes, homes and wider community. The event will begin at St Joseph cemetery in Keene at Ipm Sunday January 16. Deacon Ken will lead us in the first days novena. The remaining 8 days will be done privately. At the conclusion, the event will move to St Bernard church where at 2pm the Love for Life and Youth ministries will lead a pro-life rosary assisted by our parishioners. All are welcome.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults



Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens (unbaptized) and Rite of Welcoming (baptized)

The **Rite of Acceptance** is a formal ceremony that takes place during the liturgical celebration of Mass. It is of great importance because it symbolizes a stage of growth in catechumens on their journey of faith. It is their first recognition and consecration by the Church. They will declare their intent to continue to immerse themselves in the teachings and traditions of our Catholic Faith until such time as they are ready to become one with us through the sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist).

This Sunday, January 9th, at St. Bernard's 11:15 am Mass, we will celebrate this first consecration and formal Rite for our catechumen, Jason Russell.

We will also celebrate the **Rite of Welcoming the Baptized** with our candidates Melissa Butler, Ty Brown, Stan Castor, and Derek Forcier. They will continue their catechetical formation until such time as they are ready to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church.

From this time on, after each Sunday's homily, our catechumen, Jason, will be called up for a blessing and then sent to "Break Open the Word of God" and be further nourished by the scripture readings of the day.

Look to these Rites as a powerful witness and example of people seeking out God's will for their lives. It is an invitation for all of us to be consciously growing in faith. It is the Body of Christ that all are baptized into and it is the same Body of Christ that nourishes and supports our faith. For this reason, as we gather together in the name of Jesus Christ to worship as community, we ask that you support our catechumen and candidates through your prayers and as living examples of what it means to be a Catholic Christian. 
