

St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out; St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.



Pastor's Corner

Wednesday, March 2 of this year is the start of Lent. The Christmas Season just ended and I'm looking forward to Lent and Easter Seasons?! There should be no separation of these celebrations in time or thought. Celebrating the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time on this Sunday, we can connect back to the Epiphany of the Lord. The fathers of the Church show Epiphany, Baptism of the Lord, and the Canaan story as one story with three parts. Each reveal who Jesus is and more. Particularly important are the truths that relate to us as Catholic Christians. From the story of Epiphany, we learn that Jesus offered salvation to all nations, not just for the people of Israel—although they are included. This is our salvation as well. From Jesus 'baptism by John we learn that Jesus makes holy the waters into which he enters. From the wedding at Canaan we learn that Jesus transforms the water into wine. Something good is transformed into something better. In these revelations there are transformations from one good to a greater one. At Epiphany we saw a transformation of salvation for one nation to all nations. At the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan we see a transformation of baptism of repentance to baptism that forgives sins, with the offer of the gift of the Holy Spirit. At the wedding feast in Canaan we see the transformation of water into wine. These should prepare us to accept other transformations. We can more readily rejoice that bread and wine are transformed into the body and blood of Christ. We have this at every Eucharist. We will enter into it more intensely in Lent and Easter. With all this in mind let us allow every part of our lives to be transformed by the Eucharist.

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more Innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! Question:


How can we pray for the dead throughout the year?
