A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Please God you may continue, closely united with one another, to be a force of renewal and hope in our society. May the Lord help you to work *ceaselessly to enable all, believers and non-believers* alike, to understand that protection of human life from conception is an essential condition for building a future worthy of the human being.

On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

On June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. *Wade*, and we praise God for the great opportunity state and federal legislators now have to protect preborn children. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to pre-born children. So, great prayer and advocacy is very needed.
