Each bus will make a drink and restroom stop as it gets near Washington, DC. Each bus will drop off all passengers at a designated tour bus loading/unloading zone in the 1700 block of Constitution Avenue, NW in DC about 11:00 am. Passengers will walk to the rally site on the national mall south of Constitution Avenue, NW between 14th and 12th Streets. The three buses will park in the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception parking lot.

To begin the return trip, passengers will leave the march route at 400 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW at about 2:45 PM to walk to the designated tour bus loading/unloading zone in the 400 block of Jefferson Drive, SW (Museum of the American Indian).

Passengers will board their bus at this designated zone near the Museum of the America at about 2:55 PM.
