

## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Well, here we are on the cusp of the month of February. I think it is curious that, in the dead of Winter, there are three major days during the month. Those three days are - St. Blaise Day, St. Valentine's Day (2/14), and Ash Wednesday (2/17). Since St. Blaise Day is February 3, I will write about him.

St. Blaise was born in the third century. He was the bishop of Sebastea, Armenia. He worked hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of the people. Even though the Edict of Tolerance was supposed to relieve the suffering of Christians in the Roman Empire in 311, it was still happening in Armenia. Bishop Blaise, as a result, was forced to flee to the "back country." There he was forced to live as a hermit in solitude and prayer. In doing so, he made friends with wild animals. One day, a group of hunters stumbled upon St. Blaise's cave. They were first surprised, then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer, surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions, and bears.

As the hunter's hauled Bishop Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son, who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Bishop Blaise's command, the child coughed up the bone. While under arrest, the governor tried to persuade Bishop Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. When he refused, he was subjected to extreme torture before being executed.

Because St. Blaise's biography was not written until 400 years after his death, there was ample opportunity for perhaps some fiction to be mixed with fact. What is most important and cannot be argued is that St. Blaise is seen as one more example of the power of those who give themselves entirely to Jesus. We ask for his protection whether it be through the blessing of our throats, collectively as a church this year because of the pandemic. (No individual blessings.)

Looking ahead, I invite you to start considering your plans for Lent. We have been called to sacrifice for the last 10 plus months in ways that were difficult to imagine. However, we are still to be considered blessed compared to so many others near and far. Please consider not just the charitable aspect of Lent, but some type of fasting that places you in greater union with those suffering in the world so that you may pray for them more earnestly.






Cafe Justo Coffee FOR SALE:


