

**Road to Hope**

- The cycle of addiction has five stages – 1. Behavior 2. Pleasure or Relief 3. Seeking the Effects 4. Interference, and 5. Struggle. Most family members don’t realize the severity of the addiction until stages 4 and 5, but they begin to notice signs.
- When family members recognize stages 4 and 5, they begin to feel angry, confused, desperate to protect or save the loved one, and angry at God.
- Family members begin to demonstrate their own behaviors, such as constant worry and covering up for their loved one’s behavior.
- Boundaries begin to fade between the afflicted and family members as the family becomes unstable. Family and friends become frustrated because they cannot “fix” the addiction of their loved one.



## October 1, 2021 PARISHES OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BOSTON RAISE \$442,000 FOR HAITI RELIEF

The parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston raised \$442,000 through a special collection in late August for earthquake relief efforts in Haiti. On August 14th a deadly earthquake struck Haiti causing great loss of life and enormous damage. The special collection supports relief efforts operated by Catholic Relief Services (CRS) and the Church in Haiti. Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley, OFM said, "We are blessed by the generosity of our parishioners and the deep and prayerful concern for the suffering being experienced by the Haitian people. The funds raised by the special collection will be a great help to meeting the many diverse needs in Haiti."




