

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Happy Thanksgiving (weekend)! I am actually extending this greeting to you well in advance since my writing deadlines are earlier than usual this month with November having two holiday weekends.

How curious it is that our nation (under President Abraham Lincoln) has set aside a day “to give thanks.” As we celebrate, and hopefully count, our blessings, it is very important to remember WHO we are thanking. It is not Lady Luck, it is not karma, it is not good fortune. It is indeed God, the origin and giver of all that is good. As we offer God prayers of thanks, how important it is that we keep our eyes focused on God and what we are thanking God for, as opposed to letting our eyes and attention wander to the left or to the right in order to compare our blessings with those of others. There are many “intangible” blessings we can count that we have received from God, such as the ability to love, listen, appreciate, advise, laugh, trust, be generous, be thankful... We thank God for the roof over our head, the meal we sit before, the bed we sleep in, the heat that warms us, the warm love of another, the health that we do have. We also thank God for this great nation we live in and all the freedoms we enjoy. St. Ignatius of Loyola said that all sin is rooted in being ungrateful. Let us always be grateful and always remember who we are to be grateful to. Let us pray for an “attitude of gratitude.”

Once again, we enter into a new church year and the Season of Advent. This time of the year we are to make room for and reflect on the Prince of Peace. However, I cannot help but think that the stress most people experience this time of the year is due to anxiety over preparing for our encounters with others, whether it be through gift-giving, guests attending a Christmas gathering we are hosting, or house guests. The fact that the Season of Advent is barely over three weeks this year certainly does not take away any of the stress associated with this season.

While we seek to be accommodating hosts / hostesses and be attentive to the needs others have expressed to us, we have to remember that God does not ask us to lose our “sense of self”, our core identity, in the midst of it all. If we believe that God the Father sent his only Son to redeem the world, we do well to ask ourselves “How is my preparation enhancing this belief in my own life and how will those experiencing the fruits of my preparation be reminded of this?”

Preparing for Christmas is meant to enhance our personal relationship with Jesus Christ through the act of sacrifice. For Jesus, this meant giving up all the “perks” of heaven for 33 years and nine months in order to come to earth and redeem us. Let us keep this in mind as we sacrifice for others in order to enhance our time with them, but not to the point of sacrificing our sense of self as we seek to deepen our relationship with the Newborn Savior. The identity which we took on during our Baptism, being Christian, is always to be our first in how we define ourselves.

Hold on, what exactly is a synod?

A synod is a gathering, traditionally of bishops, that helps the Church to walk forward together in the same direction. The word “synod” comes from the Greek *syn-hodos*, meaning “the same way” or “the same path.”

Synods were common in the first centuries of the Christianity, giving bishops the opportunities to meet and discuss issues of importance for the life of the Church.

What's unique about this synod on synodality?

Unlike past synods, this one isn't about addressing a particular issue but about becoming who God calls us to be as a Church, all of us together, amidst the reality of today's world! The Synod starting in October 2021 is totally

unprecedented: The aim is not just to talk *about* synodality, but to **put synodality into practice from now onwards**, in every diocese, parish, and country across the whole world. This calls all of us, at every level of the Church, to renew our way of being and working together moving forward.

The path to a Church that listens and walks together starts with you and me. Let's walk forward together!



Lowell Mason House Concert Will Be LIVE Once Again
At 7 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 4, the 7th Annual Lowell Mason House Holiday Concert will return as a LIVE performance to be held in a new venue, St. Edward Church, 133 Spring Street in Medfield. With "Music Creates Community" as the theme of this year's event, the concert will feature remarks by Jerry Kazanjian, retired Holliston Band Director and Medfield resident of more than 43 years.

Weather permitting, concert attendees will be treated to an outdoor choral performance kicking off the event, as well as a community sing-along to conclude the night in keeping with the theme. Among the featured performers in this year's 2021 concert will be:

MEMO Joy to the World outstanding performers.

Tickets for the Lowell Mason House concert are now available online via LowellMasonHouse.net. Beginning Nov. 21, they will also be sold at the Medfield Senior Center, as well as at the concert door.

Prices are \$20 for each adult ticket; \$15 each for seniors and students; and \$50 for families of any size. Groups of students or seniors can also take advantage of the family discount if tickets are purchased together.

Known as the Father of Music Education in America's schools, Lowell Mason was born in Medfield in 1792, and historical references state that he learned to play several instruments at a young age, became the choir director of his church at age 16, and directed the Medfield town band. In addition to Mason's role in music education and as a director, he was also a composer and arranger who collaborated on a number of well-known songs, including the holiday classic, "Joy to the World," and the lesser known, "Christmas Bells."

Each year proceeds from the annual holiday concert bring the Lowell Mason House renovation and construction efforts closer to completion for the ultimate benefit of music educators, students and the community at large.


