

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners and Extended Family Members,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We have now, as a worldwide church community, left the church's shortest season, Christmas, and entered into its longest season, Ordinary Time. I personally think Ordinary Time gets a "bad rap." If we are not careful, it can be thought of as "filler" between seasons we are more familiar with, or as filling up the time between celebrations. I will admit, it can even be tempting for me to feel this way when I read the readings for a given Sunday during Ordinary Time.

A fact of life is that we live the majority of in ordinary moments. Yes, there are peaks and valleys we experience, much like the fact that we do not celebrate Christmas or Easter without participating in the seasons of Advent or Lent first. Advent and Lent allow us the opportunity to experience a valley or two to both prepare us to celebrate Christmas and Easter, as well as help us make these celebrations more meaningful. Our lives are not designed to go from peak to valley to peak, but rather transition from one to the other with the help of ordinary moments in between.

You and I both may be tempted to ask, "Well then, how DO we celebrate the ordinary? What do we point to as the cause, the focus of our celebration? The readings in ordinary time still allow us to get to know Jesus better, just not as dramatically as the other season enable us to do. This, however, can bring us to a greater appreciation of the human side of Jesus, if we allow it to. I heard it once said that if the days-in-the-life of Jesus were all added up between the four gospels written by the evangelists, the total number of days would come to a total of 73. Three years of public ministry and all that is written about is 73 days' worth?! REALLY?!

To appreciate this, we do well to step back and imagine ourselves in the time of Jesus as he went going between the towns and the cities. What did Jesus talk with his Apostles about as he constantly journeyed by foot? When Jesus healed so many people that an exact number could not be determined, how much time did he spend with each individual to get to know them and actually ask them what they desired before he healed them?

As we imagine the ordinary life of Jesus during Ordinary Time, perhaps we can come to a greater appreciation of our own ordinary time and how it is to be lived meaningfully rather than just waiting for the next celebration.

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading:

The prophet Isaiah used marriage imagery (bridge and groom) to describe the Lord's love for his people, Israel. What do you see as some implications of this marriage imagery?

Second Reading:

Paul taught the Corinthians that the individual gifts of the Holy Spirit are meant to benefit and unify the community of faith. How do you use your spiritual gifts within your faith community?

Gospel:

Jesus turning water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana was one of the first public "signs" he performed revealing his divinity. It also showed Jesus' compassion, sparing the family shame at running short of wine. How do you imagine the family reacted to Jesus' intervention and rescue?


Important Notice


- Parish phishing is on the increase. Be cautious of these types of communications:
- Are you available to do something for me, I am at a meeting?
- Your password needs to be changed.
- Attachments, including invoices, delivery notices, Amazon, Apple, etc. Especially if unexpected or apparently sent in error. Do not open attachments but delete the email.
- Links: like attachments, hackers use links as the means to install malware or to steal data (username and passwords). Do not click on a link unless it is from a known origin, and you are expecting it.
- Please be cautious of any requests for gift cards.
- Be cautious of any emails that request very quick action.
- Always call and confirm any emails that pertain to a financial transaction, e.g., new banking information, account changes, new direct deposit instructions, etc.



Cafe Justo is a coffee collaborative of farmers.


