Due to COVID19-related restrictions, we are currently admitting people to weekend Masses by reservation. Call 410-208-2956 and ask for extension 211 to make a reservation. If our automated phone system answers, immediately enter “*211” (i.e., star-2-1-1).

Masses are being celebrated publically on Saturday afternoon at 4:00 PM, on Sunday morning at 9:00 and 11:00 AM, and on Monday, Tuesday and Friday at 9:00 AM. Reservations are not required for Monday, Tuesday or Friday. Church doors are locked 10 minutes prior to the start of Mass; all attendees must be seated by then.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Reconciliation is always available by appointment. In addition, times set aside for “walk in” reconciliation will be announced from time to time in this bulletin.

BAPTISM: Please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays, generally the first Sunday of the month.

MATRIMONY: Please contact the Parish Office at least one year in advance of desired date and prior to making any arrangements for the wedding reception. Weddings are celebrated on Saturdays.

CONFIRMATION: Please contact the Director of Religious Education (410-208-2854) for information. Confirmation is conferred in the 8th Grade.

SAINT JOHN NEUMANN ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH



Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As the green vestments this weekend indicate, the Church throughout the world has begun the Liturgical season called “Ordinary Time.” There’s actually very little *ordinary* about what we do when we come together as Church; we praise a God Whom we cannot see; we offer bread and wine and receive in return the Lord of the Universe; we eat and drink and thus enter into communion with God. That’s hardly “ordinary.”

In fact, in the context of liturgy, “ordinary” does not mean “set apart from the extraordinary.” “Ordinary time” comes from the Latin phrase *tempus ordinarium* and means “measured time.” It’s time that is “ordered” for the everyday living of Christian life. For the Christian, every day presents opportunities to grow in closer union with God; even times and seasons are created to help us as we move toward the salvation God has prepared for us in Jesus Christ.

Ordinary Time lasts until Ash Wednesday (17 February this year), the beginning of Lent; it resumes on 24 May, the day after Pentecost Sunday, and then runs to its completion on the last day before the beginning of Advent, Saturday, 27 November.

On another note, please keep in mind that the Holy Father has declared a “Year of St. Joseph” which began on December 8. Pope Francis encourages us to recite this daily prayer during this special year:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage,
and defend us from every evil. Amen.

The Holy Father also made reference to a prayer to St. Joseph that he himself has recited daily for over 40 years:

Glorious Patriarch Saint Joseph,
whose power makes the impossible possible,
come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty.
Take under your protection
the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you,
that they may have a happy outcome.
My beloved father, all my trust is in you.
Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain,
and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary,
show me that your goodness is as great as your power. Amen.

May St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, intercede for us in these difficult days. And may God bless you, always!

PS: On Monday, 11 January, we received the following notice from the Vicar General: “Normally this is the time of year that we hold elections for our lay parish trustee positions. However, with our current COVID-19 safety guidelines in place it is not practical to conduct a proper election at this time. Therefore, Bishop Malooly has directed us to move the annual parish trustee elections to sometime in early July. Hopefully by that time we will be able to safely and properly elect our lay trustees. The Bishop has the authority to move the elections in accordance with the relevant Delaware and Maryland laws of incorporation. Until the elections are held in July, the current trustees may continue to fulfill their duties.” In response to my request for nominations in last week’s bulletin, we had already received two nominations. Rest assured, those nomination will appear on the ballot in July when we are given approval to resume the election.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (17 January, 2021)

Entrance Antiphon: All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, and shall sing to you, shall sing to your name, O Most High!

Gloria: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading: 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

Psalm Response: *Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.*

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

Gospel: *John 1:35-42*

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus

was staying and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, “We have found the Messiah” — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas” — which is translated Peter.

The Profession of Faith: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


INCLEMENT WEATHER AND MASS



