HOLY EUCHARIST (THE SACRIFICE OF THE MASS)

Due to COVID19-related restrictions, we are currently admitting people to weekend Masses by reservation. Call 410-208-2956 and ask for extension 211 to make a reservation. If our automated phone system answers, immediately enter “*211” (i.e., star-2-1-1).

Masses are being celebrated publically on Saturday afternoon at 4:00 PM, on Sunday morning at 9:00 and 11:00 AM, and on Monday, Tuesday and Friday at 9:00 AM. Reservations are not required for Monday, Tuesday or Friday. Church doors are locked 10 minutes prior to the start of Mass; all attendees must be seated by then.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Reconciliation is always available by appointment. In addition, times set aside for “walk in” reconciliation will be announced from time to time in this bulletin.

BAPTISM: Please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays, generally the first Sunday of the month.

MATRIMONY: Please contact the Parish Office at least one year in advance of desired date and prior to making any arrangements for the wedding reception. Weddings are celebrated on Saturdays.

CONFIRMATION: Please contact the Director of Religious Education (410-208-2854) for information. Confirmation is conferred in the 8th Grade.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Please inform the Parish Office about parishioners who need this sacrament as soon as their illness becomes serious.

HOLY ORDERS: If you believe you are being called by God to serve the Church as a Catholic priest, please contact Father Norman Carroll, Director of Vocations (302-573-3113) or speak to the Pastor; if you believe you are being called to the Diaconate, please call Rev. John Grasing (302-573-2390).

SACRAMENTALS: For the renewal of marriage vows and the blessing of homes, religious articles, automobiles, boats, and other appropriate items, please contact the Pastor.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The pandemic has made the past twelve months fly by. It's hard to believe that Lent is upon us!

While we will not be under the same lockdown conditions that prevailed last Lent, things will still not be "back to normal." For the moment, I just want to focus on how the pandemic will affect Ash Wednesday.

- First of all, please remember that receiving ashes is not – and has never been – required. It is a sacramental, not a sacrament: a devotional act that helps some people enter into the spirit of Lent. Father Joseph McQuaide, chancellor of the Diocese of Wilmington (and one-time seminarian here at St. John Neumann) writes "The faithful should recognize that their own internal disposition and intention to repent is the importance of Ash Wednesday and that the ashes are an external sign of that internal reality. Individuals who cannot receive ashes can still enter into Lent with a repentant heart." In other words, the important thing is the intention to repent. Without that intention, the ashes mean nothing; with that intention, the ashes are not necessary to start a good Lent.
- There will be one Mass on Ash Wednesday morning at 9:00. Attendance at this Mass will be by reservation only. There will be no "walk-ins." To make a reservation, call the parish's front office (410-208-2956) on Tuesday February 16 between 10 AM and 2 PM. That's a short window, I know, but it's enough for the limited seating that we have available. Remember, social distance spacing is still required by the state of Maryland. Masks are required and temperature checks will be performed.
- There will be two brief Scripture services, one at 12:00 Noon and one at 6:00 PM. At the end of each of these services, ashes will be imposed on the faithful who wish them. There will be no reservations for these services; they'll be "first-come, first-seated." Once the church is full (by social distancing standards), others will be allowed to wait in their cars until the end of the service, when they will be ushered into the church in an orderly and safe fashion to receive ashes. No one will be admitted without a mask and everyone will be subjected to a temperature check.
- If you or someone in your house has been exposed to someone who has tested positive for the coronavirus within the last week, please do not come for ashes. We have a responsibility to keep each other safe.
- The way the ashes are distributed will be different from what you've experienced in the past. The person administering the ashes will not say anything to you. Instead, after sprinkling the ashes with holy water, the priest or deacon will address all those present by saying: "Repent and believe in the Gospel." When you approach the person who will be giving you ashes, make sure your mask is on properly and bow your head. Ashes will not be placed on your forehead. Instead, they will be sprinkled on the crown of your head. No exceptions. Sprinkling ashes on the top of the head is the way this is done in most parts of the world and actually corresponds better to Jesus' injunction in the 16th chapter of St. Matthew's gospel: "When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to others to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you" (6: 16-18).

Life is complicated these days, and we all look forward to a time when we can return to a more normal way of doing things. In the meantime, we do the best we can to stay safe and to keep each other safe.

First Reading: *Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46*

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "If someone has on his skin a scab or pustule or blotch which appears to be the sore of leprosy, he shall be brought to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests among his descendants. If the man is leprous and unclean, the priest shall declare him unclean by reason of the sore on his head. "The one who bears the sore of leprosy shall keep his garments rent and his head bare, and shall muffle his beard; he shall cry out, 'Unclean, unclean!' As long as the sore is on him he shall declare himself unclean, since he is in fact unclean. He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

Psalms Response: *I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.*

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1*

Brothers and sisters, Whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God. Avoid giving offense, whether to the Jews or Greeks or the church of God, just as I try to please everyone in every way, not seeking my own benefit but that of the many, that they may be saved. Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

Gospel: *Mark 1:40-45*

A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean." The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean. Then, warning him sternly, he dismissed him at once. He said to him, "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest and offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them." The man went away and

began to publicize the whole matter. He spread the report abroad so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly. He remained outside in deserted places, and people kept coming to him from everywhere.

The Profession of Faith: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Communion Antiphon: They ate and had their fill, and what they craved the Lord gave them; they were not disappointed in what they craved.

An Act of Spiritual Communion: My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.


