Due to COVID19-related restrictions, we are currently admitting people to weekend Masses by reservation. Call 410-208-2956 and ask for extension 211 to make a reservation. If our automated phone system answers, immediately enter “*211” (i.e., star-2-1-1).

Masses are being celebrated publically on Saturday afternoon at 4:00 PM, on Sunday morning at 9:00 and 11:00 AM, and on Monday, Tuesday and Friday at 9:00 AM. Reservations are not required for Monday, Tuesday or Friday. Church doors are locked 10 minutes prior to the start of Mass; all attendees must be seated by then.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Reconciliation is always available by appointment. In addition, times set aside for “walk in” reconciliation will be announced from time to time in this bulletin.

BAPTISM: Please contact the Parish Office. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays, generally the first Sunday of the month.

MATRIMONY: Please contact the Parish Office at least one year in advance of desired date and prior to making any arrangements for the wedding reception. Weddings are celebrated on Saturdays.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

One of the most popular and beloved Lenten devotions in the Catholic Church is the praying of the “Stations of the Cross.” The “stations” are images depicting Jesus as He goes from His condemnation by Pontius Pilate to His crucifixion on Calvary and His burial in the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea. Praying the Stations helps us make a spiritual pilgrimage by contemplating the Lord’s Passion.

Various remarks by His Holiness Pope Francis provide many good reasons for engaging in this devotion, and I’d like to point to some of them here.

1. The Stations Allow Us to Place Our Trust in Jesus: “The Cross of Christ contains all the love of God; there we find his immeasurable mercy. This is a love in which we can place all our trust, in which we can believe.... let us entrust ourselves to Jesus, let us give ourselves over to him, because he never disappoints anyone! Only in Christ crucified and risen can we find salvation and redemption.” (Address, World Youth Day, Way of the Cross, 26 July 2013)
2. They Put Us into the Story: “And you, who do you want to be? Like Pilate? Like Simon? Like Mary? Jesus is looking at you now and is asking you: do you want to help me carry the Cross? Brothers and sisters, with all the strength of your youth, how will you respond to him?” (Ibid.)
3. They Remind Us That Jesus Suffers with Us: “The Cross of Christ bears the suffering and the sin of mankind, including our own. Jesus accepts all this with open arms, bearing on his shoulders our crosses and saying to us: ‘Have courage! You do not carry your cross alone! I carry it with you. I have overcome death and I have come to give you hope, to give you life’ (cf. John 3:16).” (Ibid.)
4. They Compel Us to Action: “But the Cross of Christ invites us also to allow ourselves to be smitten by his love, teaching us always to look upon others with mercy and tenderness, especially those who suffer, who are in need of help, who need a word or a concrete action.” (Ibid.)
5. They Help Us Make a Decision for or Against Christ: “[The Cross] reveals a judgment, namely that God, in judging us, loves us. Let us remember this: God judges us by loving us. If I embrace his love then I am saved, if I refuse it, then I am condemned, not by him, but my own self, because God never condemns, he only loves and saves.” (Address, Good Friday, 29 March 2013)
6. They Reveal God’s Response to Evil in the World: “The Cross is the word through which God has responded to evil in the world. Sometimes it may seem as though God does not react to evil, as if he is silent. And yet, God has spoken, he has replied, and his answer is the Cross of Christ: a word which is love, mercy, forgiveness.” (Ibid.)
7. They Give Us the Certainty of God’s Love for Us: “What has the Cross given to those who have gazed upon it and to those who have touched it? What has the Cross left in each one of us? You see, it gives us a treasure that no one else can give: the certainty of the faithful love which God has for us.” (World Youth Day, see above)
8. They Guide Us from the Cross to the Resurrection: “O Jesus, guide us from the Cross to the resurrection and teach us that evil shall not have the last word, but love, mercy and forgiveness. O Christ, help us to exclaim again: ‘Yesterday I was crucified with Christ; today I am glorified with Him. Yesterday I died with Him, today I live with Him. Yesterday I was buried with Him, today I am raised with Him.’” (Address, Good Friday, 18 April 2014)

This year, because of the ongoing pandemic, St. John Neumann is hosting the Stations of the Cross virtually on our YouTube page. While it is quite a different experience making the stations at home, there are a number of advantages. For one thing, you can celebrate this devotion whenever – and as often – as you like. On top of that, you can hit the “pause” button if you wish to spend more time praying over a particular station; this can be a great bonus if your prayer life leans toward the contemplative. The text of the stations used on our YouTube page is taken from St. Francis of Assisi’s version of the devotion.

I hope you’ll take advantage of this powerful aid to Lenten prayer. Already, our “stations” have been accessed over 300 times! May they be a source of grace to all who choose to use them for prayer.

Third Sunday of Lent (7 March, 2021)

Entrance Antiphon: My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

First Reading: *Exodus 20:1-3, 7-8, 12-17*

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. "You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. For the LORD will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain. "Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the Lord, your God, is giving you. You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male or female slave, nor his ox or ass, nor anything else that belongs to him."

Psalm Response: *Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.*

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 1:22-25*

Brothers and sisters: Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

Verse Before the Gospel:

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might have eternal life.

Gospel: *John 2:13-25*

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

The Profession of Faith: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Communion Antiphon: The sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for her young: by your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise.

An Act of Spiritual Communion: My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
