Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

“Fatherhood is a vocation in God’s service not to be held lightly or frivolously but with the serious determination of serious men.” I wish I could take credit for that quote, but, in fact, I saw it on a sign for sale on a Christian gift-shop’s webpage sometime last year. It moved me then, and it continues to move me; many of the severe problems of some segments of our nation’s population are directly related to the lack of fatherly presence in the lives of young men.

In the Church, we’ve also suffered from a lack of good fatherhood. One could cite the behavior of some bishops and priests which have not been fatherly at all. One can also note how in many “Catholic” households, fathers have abdicated their responsibilities, particularly their responsibility to raise their children in the practice of the faith. In our parish, we’re blessed with a cadre of dads who take their vocations as Catholic fathers very seriously, and in doing so they help build up the Body of Christ in a tangible way.

Make no mistake: Christ expects every Catholic father to seek holiness and perfection. Ultimately, each of us will stand before His judgement throne and be asked to give an accounting for how we lived out our vocations; fathers will have to acknowledge before the Lord just how well they shepherded their children. For that reason, as we celebrate Fathers’ Day, let me exhort the fathers in our parish to assess prayerfully their effectiveness as *fathers for Christ* and to vow to become “Committed Catholic Fathers.”

The “New Emangelization Project” (<https://www.newemangelization.com/man-crisis/the-catholic-man-crisis-factsheet/>) defines a *Committed Catholic Father* as a man who practices the faith and is committed to pass it along to his children and to actively evangelize others. He works hard to ensure that his children know the fullness of the truth of the Catholic faith; he helps them develop their knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. He gets involved with the catechesis of his children at home and may help mentor and teach the Catholic faith to other young people in the parish. He helps his children understand the importance of both truth and mercy. Most importantly, the *Committed Catholic Father* relies on the graces of the Sacraments, works hard to live the perfect balance of Christ’s truth and Christ’s mercy in all his dealings with his family.

Fathers’ Day is a blessing, not only because it reinforces the essential need for fathers but because it offers Catholic men the chance to reflect on their own performance as fathers. This Fathers’ Day, regardless of the falterings of the past, each man can be a new creation in Christ, becoming a *Committed Catholic Father* who fulfills his solemn promise and leads his children to Christ Jesus.

So . . . Happy Fathers’ Day to our dads, and God’s blessing on all of you!

DISPENSATION LIFTED

Bishop Malooly, has lifted the dispensation, thereby reinstating the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation for Catholics in the Diocese of Wilmington, effective **June 26, 2021**. The dispensation that went into effect on March 13, 2020, was put in place to help limit the spread of coronavirus, and allow the Diocese of Wilmington to conform to guidelines and regulations adopted by the States of Delaware and Maryland.

Our bishop decided to lift the dispensation because the average number of new cases of COVID-19 continues to decline due to the observance of safety protocols and the increased availability of the vaccine. The obligation does not apply to those who are ill, have been exposed to the virus, or have any serious underlying health conditions.

We welcome and encourage the Faithful to return to full in-person participation of the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith. Let us continue to be united in prayer for one another and for an end to the global pandemic. More information is available at www.cdw.org/coronavirus.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First Reading: *Job 38:1, 8-11*

The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said: Who shut within doors the sea, when it burst forth from the womb; when I made the clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling bands? When I set limits for it and fastened the bar of its door, and said: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled!

Psalm Response: *Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting.*

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 5:14-17*

Brothers and sisters: The love of Christ impels us, once we have come to the conviction that one died for all; therefore, all have died. He indeed died for all, so that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised. Consequently, from now on we regard no one according to the flesh; even if we once knew Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know him so no longer. So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.

Gospel: *Mark 4:35-41*

On that day, as evening drew on, Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us cross to the other side." Leaving the crowd, they took Jesus with them in the boat just as he was. And other boats were with him. A violent squall came up and waves were breaking over the boat, so that it was already filling up. Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" They were filled with great awe and said to one another, "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

The Profession of Faith: I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Communion Antiphon: The eyes of all look *to you, Lord*, and you give them their food *in due season*.

An Act of Spiritual Communion: My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.


