Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

By longstanding Church tradition, in November of each year we interact with those who have gone before us into eternal life. There are three “movements” to this interaction: the Solemnity of All Saints, the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, and the observance of November as the month to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

On the Solemnity of All Saints (November 1) we honor those whose sanctity was so obvious that Holy Mother Church is able to declare with no hesitation that they are enjoying the Kingdom of Heaven. We also pray to them, asking them to intercede for us with God, that we might receive and take advantage of those graces we need to join them in Christ. (Note: we pray to the saints, we honor them, but we do not worship them.)

On the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (November 2), we pray for our loved ones who have died. This is closely related to the month-long prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Why focus on the souls in Purgatory? Well, the souls in Heaven do not need our prayers; they are enjoying the fullness of life in Christ. We pray *to* them, not *for* them. The souls in Hell – well, there’s simply nothing we can do for them. Hell is permanent. But the souls in Purgatory are on the way to Heaven; they are being purified – purged – so as to be ready to be presented before the great King.

Purgatory is the most hope-filled doctrine in Christianity. It is a doctrine that proclaims that what we do in the present life really does matter.

Think of this: when we practice authentic Christian love, we open within our hearts a space for God to dwell. We grow more and more into the Body of Christ. So, when we pray for the dead, we pray that this transformation may continue in the humanity of the faithful departed. We pray that our beloved dead grow in their deep love of God, in their capacity to join the heavenly banquet. But, as Christians, we’re called to pray not just for our family members and friends who have died, but for all of the faithful departed. God’s love can transform the darkest, the most hardened of hearts. The only souls who are outside the scope of such a cleansing are those who have consciously rejected God’s invitation. God always invites; He never forces us.

Let me encourage you, then, to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Here’s an appropriate prayer, taken from a Novena for the Holy Souls:

My God, because You are infinite goodness, I love You above all things; I repent with my whole heart for my offenses against You. Grant me the grace of holy perseverance. Have compassion on me, and, at the same, on the holy souls suffering in Purgatory. And You, Mary, Mother of God, come to their assistance with thy powerful intercession.

May our prayers help those souls on the way to Heaven, and may they return the favor and pray for us as we make our pilgrimage. God bless you!



Second Reading: Heb 7: 23-28

Brothers and sisters: The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

Gospel: Mk 12: 28b-34


One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, “Which is the first of all the commandments?” Jesus replied, “The first is this: / Hear, O Israel! / The Lord our God is Lord alone! / You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, / with all your soul, / with all your mind, / and with all your strength. / The second is this: / You shall love your neighbor as yourself. / There is no other commandment greater than these.” The scribe said to him, “Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, ‘He is One and there is no other than he.’ And ‘to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself’ is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices.” And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, “You are not far from the kingdom of God.” And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

The Profession of Faith:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



From the desk of Trinette Stillman, Principal...


“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.” John 14:27


