SAINT JOHN NEUMANN ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH



Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Every so often you hear non-believers (and some misguided believers) claiming that Christmas was simply a co-opting of the pagan festival of *Natalis Solis Invicti* (the Roman emperor Aurelian's "Festival of the

Unconquerable Sun"). Next time someone tries to feed you that line, help them out a little:

"A widely held opinion is that Christ was not born on Dec. 25. Many believe we celebrate Christmas on the 25th because the third century church Christianized the day on which some pagan festivals were observed. The truth is that Roman Emperor Aurelian passed an edict in A.D. 274 establishing the festival of *Natalis Solis Invicti* ("Birthday of the Unconquerable Sun") while dedicating a temple. But such notable church fathers as Tertullian and Augustine were convinced that Christmas preceded this pagan holiday. Alvin J. Schmidt, in his scholarly work *Under the Influence: How Christianity Transformed Civilization* (2001, Zondervan), states that in northern Africa Christians were already celebrating the birth date of Jesus as Dec. 25 in A.D. 243, which was 30 years before Aurelian's edict. If this is true, it wasn't Christianity that Christianized a pagan festival but a pagan emperor attempting to paganize a Christian festival that predated it by 30 years."

(From *Rediscovering the Beauty of Christmas*, Peter Bertolero, Charisma, December 2011)

Today's "emperors" try to paganize our Feasts by referring to Christmas and Easter as "Winter Holidays" and "Spring Holidays." We'll have none of that. Some might be satisfied with "holidays"; we bask in "holy days" and those days are "holy" because of the wondrous deeds God has done for us in Jesus Christ, the only "name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved" (Acts 4:12). As the great African-American spiritual sings, "Go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!" He is the *only* reason for the season.

May God bless you, and may these days be merry, holy and bright for you and for all your loved ones!

Gospel: Lk 1: 39-45


