

Sacraments:

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Saturdays, 3:00-3:45 pm; Other times by appointment. Communal celebration seasonally.

Sacrament of Baptism: Baptisms are normally celebrated at the 4 pm vigil mass. Baptismal Preparation for parents is held in the rectory on the first Tuesday of the month at 6 pm. Please call the office at least eight weeks before the desired date to make arrangements and to begin sacramental preparation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the Parish at least six months prior to the anticipated date and before any other arrangements have been finalized to begin sacramental preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. If you are seriously ill or planning to enter the hospital, please notify the parish so that we might celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing. A communal celebration of the Sacrament takes place seasonally.



Immaculate Conception Church Mission Statement:

As a parish, which is united with the Catholic Church throughout the world, we the people of Immaculate Conception Parish proclaim our belief in the message and mission of Jesus Christ. We seek to live as a welcoming community of faith, worshipping with generations of believers and serving God in all people.

Third Sunday of Lent

Jesus tells his followers a parable that applies to us as well: "The owner of the vineyard goes to the fig tree to gather its fruit and finds none." God comes to us this Lent, looking for something he expects to find in us. Are we happy that Jesus is asking an account of us? Are we surprised? Are we afraid when we see our lives like a tree full of leaves, but without any fruit?

This episode starts off on a worrying note, but it has a happy ending. God will make a final attempt to help his tree recover: he will take away the soil, put manure around it, and will wait for one more year, being patient with what he has planted with such hopeful expectation. We can't come to the end of our lives with empty hands. Lent invites us to conversion. Is conversion a "church word?" Something we hear but don't take the time to wrestle with it? Here are some thoughts that might help make conversion less impersonal and which may allow us to accept the invitation.

1. Conversion means not being barren, dry and dead. God made us to be happy. Don't let your happiness be taken away by your difficulties at work, by nostalgia for what was. Let no adversity wipe the smile off your face. Don't allow the poison of hatred to run through your veins; always forgive. Remember that the best response to hurt will always be forgiveness.

Cardinal Newman used to say that "to live is to change, and to be perfect means to have changed often." It's not a sign of instability, but of openness to continuous novelty. We won't achieve it overnight; it is a process that lasts our whole life long.

2. Conversion means letting the Gospel penetrate our very way of being until, little by little, to allow it to fill our whole existence. Lent is a time to live as Christ taught us. Saint Paul wrote that faith without works is dead. Let's not be afraid to do what he asks of us. Rather, let us ask ourselves: what would Jesus do in my place?

3. Conversion means seeking God, walking with God, following the teachings of Jesus with humility. We need to change from within, in our heart. Then we need to change the world by bringing it the light of his Word. Lent is the springtime of the spirit; it is the fitting season to open our hearts, to see if God is already inside. Christ is waiting for us in the confessional to forgive us and forget our past offenses.

We will soon celebrate the resurrection of Christ. His victory over death and sin is also our birth to the new life of grace. Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "Lent is an opportunity to become Christians again, through a constant process of interior conversion and of growth in our knowledge and love of Christ." This is exactly what Christ wanted to teach us in the lesson of the fig tree.

Winter Weather Policy: If school in Hoosick Falls is cancelled, the parish office will be closed and all in person activities for the day and evening will be cancelled. In case of a delay, all daytime activities are cancelled and a decision about evening activities will be made by noon.



Hoosick Helpers: A ministry of care for the elderly and homebound. Some of the needs involve socialization or companionship, light housekeeping or transportation. If you are in need of assistance or have an hour to give, please call the parish office. **Volunteer helpers are needed.**







Reconciliation –The sacrament of reconciliation (sometimes also called Penance or Confession) is a time to reflect on the state of your relationship with God, with other people, and with yourself, to invite God's healing mercy and to be reconciled to the community. In our current Rite of Penance, we have three forms of the sacrament. Rite One (individual confession and absolution) is offered at Immaculate Conception each Saturday from 3- 3:45 pm. Rite Two, often used during Advent or Lent, consists of a communal celebration with readings, reflections and an examination of conscience, followed by individual confession and absolution. **A Lenten Reconciliation Service will be celebrated at Immaculate Conception at 2 pm on Sunday, March 30.**

What is Eucharistic Adoration / Exposition?

Eucharistic Adoration is a Catholic devotion dating back to the early days of the Church. It involves exposing a consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament, allowing people to sit and pray in the presence of Jesus Christ.

Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. Exposition refers specifically to prayer in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. You may hear these terms used interchangeably.

During Eucharistic Adoration, it's important to enter the church or chapel in silence and reverence, genuflecting before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Chatting with friends should be avoided during adoration, this is to take place outside.

During Eucharistic Adoration, it is appropriate to do any of the following...

Read and reflect on readings from the Bible or other spiritual writings

Pray the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet or any other favorite devotions

Converse with God through spontaneous prayer or Journaling

Sit quietly and listen or just enjoy being in the presence of Christ


When is Eucharistic Adoration offered?

Eucharistic Adoration is available whenever the Church building is open. Anyone is welcome to come and pray in front of the closed Tabernacle.

Eucharistic Exposition is offered at Immaculate Conception after the 9 am mass on the first Monday of the month and a **Special Lenten 12 hour Adoration (Exposition)** will be offered at St. Patrick's Church on Wednesday, April 2, 9 am - 9 pm. Please sign up for a time slot as the church must never be empty during Exposition.
