

From the Desk of Father Ryan

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever! This weekend we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin, Corpus Christi). This feast day allows us to reflect on the greatest gift God has given to His Church, namely, the gift of Himself in the Most Holy Eucharist. We believe that the Most Blessed Sacrament is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ; the Eucharist is God Himself, present to us under what appears to the human eye to be bread and wine. The Church tells us that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives; in other words, everything we do should flow from the Eucharist, and everything we do should lead us back to it. This weekend. we will take our Lord in procession through the streets of our neighborhood (if the weather permits). We will publicly declare our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and we will ask Him to send His grace upon our parish wider community. Through this Eucharistic procession, may our Lord fill us with a deeper faith, may He bring back those who have fallen away from their faith, and may He draw every person in our communities to Himself and His Church.

I want to congratulate all our parishioners who are graduating during this time of the year. They have worked very hard for this moment, and they deserve special recognition as they begin a new chapter in their lives. I was blessed to attend and offer a blessing at the graduation for the eighthgrade students at Mount Royal Academy North this past Tuesday. Let's keep all our graduates in our prayers!

The Holy Father asks for our prayers for a specific intention each month. This month we are asked to pray for the abolition of torture.






Meet Our Seminarian - Caleb Goff


