## From the Desk of Father Ryan

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever! This weekend we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin, *Corpus Christi*). This feast day allows us to reflect on the greatest gift God has given to His Church, namely, the gift of Himself in the Most Holy Eucharist. We believe that the Most Blessed Sacrament is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ; the Eucharist is God Himself, present to us under what appears to the human eye to be bread and wine. The Church tells us that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives; in other words, everything we do should flow from the Eucharist, and everything we do should lead us back to it. This weekend, we will take our Lord in procession through the streets of our neighborhood (if the weather permits). We will publicly declare our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and we will ask Him to send His grace upon our parish and the wider community. Through this Eucharistic procession, may our Lord fill us with a deeper faith, may He bring back those who have fallen away from their faith, and may He draw every person in our communities to Himself and His Church.

I want to congratulate all our parishioners who are graduating during this time of the year. They have worked very hard for this moment, and they deserve special recognition as they begin a new chapter in their lives. I was blessed to attend and offer a blessing at the graduation for the eighth-grade students at Mount Royal Academy North this past Tuesday. Let's keep all our graduates in our prayers!

I'm happy to have seminarian Caleb Goff assigned to our parish this summer. He just moved in on Monday. Please welcome him when you see him this weekend, and please read a brief biography of him in this weekend's bulletin. May God bless you all!

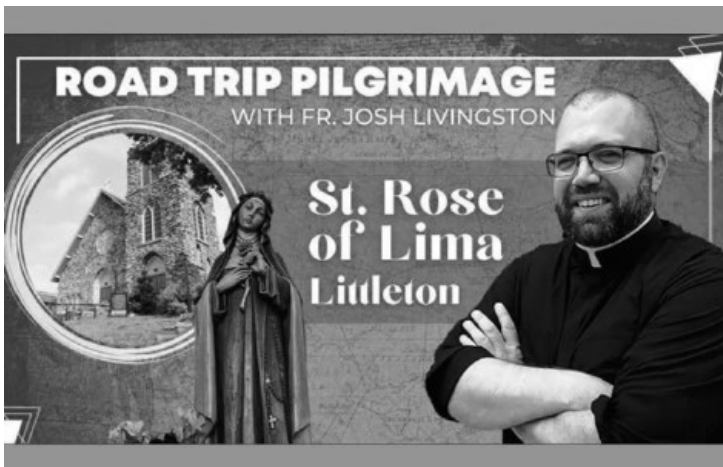

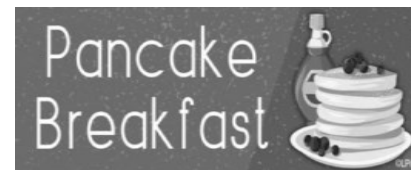

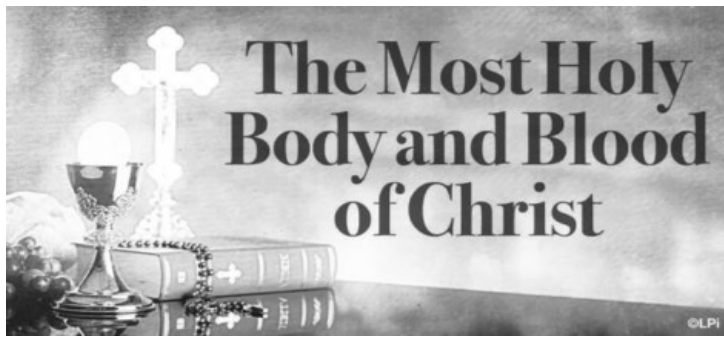

This Sunday, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*), our parish will have a Eucharistic procession around the block on which St. Rose of Lima Church is located. This procession will take place immediately following the 10:30am Mass on Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup>. It is a long-standing tradition of the Church to carry the Most Blessed Sacrament in procession after the Holy Mass on this solemn feast day. This procession gives public witness to our belief in the Real Presence of our Lord in the Holy Eucharist, and of our devotion to Him. It also serves to give adoration and worship to Christ in the Eucharist. Through this great act of devotion and faith, God bestows many graces upon those who take part in the procession, on the whole parish, and on our broader community. Please join us for this Eucharistic procession when we bring our Lord, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, into the streets of our town.

### Reflection on the Readings

#### First Reading (Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a)

At the end of their forty-year journey in the desert, Moses instructs the Israelites not to forget how God taught them to depend on Him alone. How might you remind yourself of this important lesson in life?

#### Second Reading (1 Corinthians 10:16-17)

Paul teaches the Corinthians that through the body and blood of Christ, the community of believers are "one body." Who in your life needs to hear this unifying message?

#### Gospel Reading (John 6:51-58)

Jesus teaches the crowds that through his body and blood believers will obtain eternal life and be raised on the last day. This is the core of our Catholic belief about Jesus. How do you think we can best celebrate this gift of eternal life?

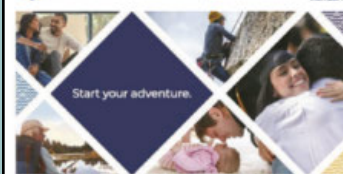

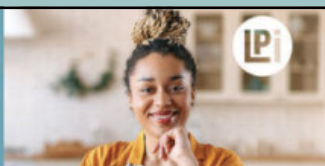
