During their captivity and exile in Babylon, God assured the Israelites He would restore them into a mighty majestic cedar tree. How do you find comfort in times of despair?

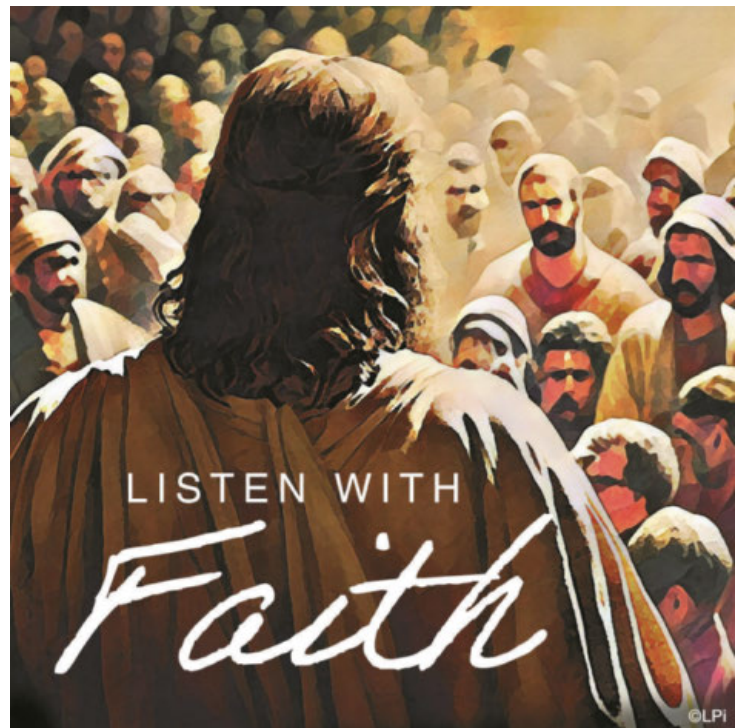
Second Reading (2 Corinthians 5:14-17)

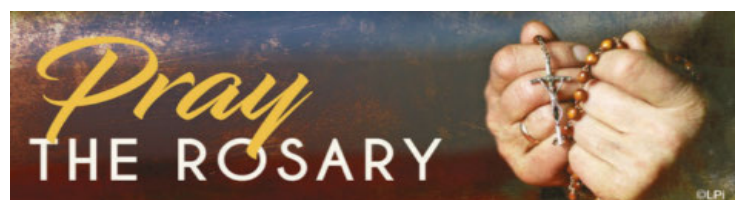

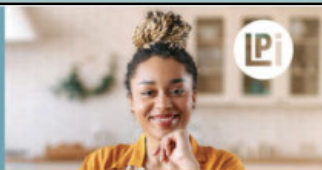
