

Praised be Jesus Christ, now and forever! This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. While we celebrated the Solemnity of the Epiphany last weekend, the Lord's Baptism is another moment of Epiphany in His life and ministry. When the Father Himself spoke from the heavens, Jesus was revealed and manifested as the Son of the Father, God's anointed one. The Lord Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist not because He needed to be baptized (He had no sin), but because by His baptism, He made holy the waters of our own baptism. This feast also marks the official end of the liturgical season of Christmas. We resume the season of Ordinary Time on Monday, and so the decorations in the Church will be taken down after this weekend. (A word of gratitude to all who donate their time to decorate our Church and to take down the decorations; a lot of work goes into this!)

The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. As the Catechism tells us, "to pray 'Jesus' is to invoke him and to call him within us. His name is the only one that contains the presence it signifies. Jesus is the Risen One, and whoever invokes the name of Jesus is welcoming the Son of God who loved him and who gave himself up for him" (CCC 2666). It is a common practice, and a long-standing tradition, to pray the "Jesus prayer," which goes like this: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." This short prayer, or just simply invoking the name of Jesus, invites the Lord to be present to us throughout the day. It is one of the shortest, and most powerful, forms of prayer. This month dedicated to His holy name also reminds us to always use His name with reverence, and never in vain, as the second commandment requires of us. In a world that so often uses this holy name in vain and disrespectfully, and even blasphemously, let's resolve as those who love the Lord to only use His name with the great reverence and respect it deserves.

I want to publicly express my gratitude to the music ministry of our parish who have worked so hard to implement some new music with the introduction of the new pew missals. They have gone above and beyond, including adding many additional rehearsals, to learn how to sing this music. They have done a tremendous job. I thank them for their dedication, faithfulness, and for sharing their gifts and talents with us to help us better worship God at Holy Mass.

NEW MUSICAL MASS SETTING

This weekend, the music ministry will begin to introduce a new musical Mass setting for the various sung parts of Mass (such as the Gloria, the Lamb of God, etc.). There are several reasons for this. First of all, the Source and Summit Missal has different musical Mass settings than the previous hymnals we used to use, and so we have to learn the new ones in the current missal. Secondly, in its liturgy, the Church has always had different music selections for the various liturgical seasons to better emphasize the spirit of that season. In Lent, you would have a simpler and more somber Mass setting, and in Easter, you would have a more festive Mass setting, for example. Lastly, while change can be difficult, changing the music selections at Mass makes us more attentive to the words we are saying. When we sing the same melody all the time, we may sing the words merely out of habit without thinking about their meaning. In the parish happenings email sent out weekly, we have a link to the new musical Mass setting we will be using. Please use this link to learn the new setting and familiarize yourself with the melodies.




