## From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parish Family,

Today's first reading turns on two meanings of the word "house" in Hebrew (bet). First it is a dwelling place and second the lineage of a notable family. King David realizes that it's shameful that the ark of God – the most concrete sign of God's presence – is housed in a tent while he lives in a palace. But the Lord tells David's advisor, the prophet Nathan, that his house – his lineage, not his palace – will be blessed and endure forever. The family David builds, a line that will include Jesus Christ, is more important than the structure for the Ark of the Covenant. More importantly, God has been dwelling with David all along: "I have been with you wherever you went". God has chosen not to dwell in a tent or a building, but in flesh and blood, in the person of David. Centuries later, Gabriel reveals to Mary that she will carry the Son of God in her womb. From her flesh will carry the Son of God no end. Each Christmas we are reminded that God chose a dwelling place more beautiful than a palace, more lasting than a family lineage: a home in flesh and blood, in humanity, in each of us. How can we best provide a dwelling place for the Lord in ourselves?

During this next week, perhaps our time can best be spent in prayer for the unborn, the newborn, the healthy, the unhealthy, the loved, the unloved, the wanted, and the unwanted. Let us pray for new mothers. Pray for the mothers, both those who carry their babies to term and those who do not. Perhaps, if we can pray our way back to the pervading sense of reverence and awe that new life ought to bring to us, we will be empowered to feel the Child leap in our hearts much as Elizabeth felt her child leap in her womb. Perhaps we will be filled with the indwelling Holy Spirit, see the blessedness of babies, hear the Word of God and say "yes" to our heart's true longing for life.

**Masses for Christmas will be at 2:00 pm on Christmas Eve and 5:00 pm on Christmas Eve. On Christmas Day we will have a Mass at 10:00 am.** We would like you to let us know if you are coming to mass for Christmas – **Please Register. We will keep a record of how many people will be attending. We can have 65 people for each mass.**

The song of Christmas is "Joy to the World." It is, indeed, "tidings of great joy to be shared by the whole people." My friends, we celebrate the birthday of our Savior Jesus Christ. We see him in a manger but we must earnestly seek that he be born in us, so that he may continue through us to be a light to the world.

On Christmas Day we ask God to accept our laughter and our love. We cannot be solemn or sad on the birthday of God's Son. There is no demand of a gift exchange but the present we make to God is our very selves, our lives made new through the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. We ask God to be the light in our darkness.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for your cooperation in our parish work and to extend to you and your loved ones my prayerful best wishes for a Holy and Blessed Christmas Day and a New Year filled with God's Hope and Peace.

And, during this Holiday Season we pray that God's hope finds its way into our homes, Churches and communities. We pray for an end to this global pandemic.






