

# From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parish Family,

You wouldn't know it from his words, but Zephaniah preached during a very difficult time. God's Chosen People had turned away from the Lord, influenced by the legacy of a corrupt king and they were compromised by Assyrian rule. Yet he wrote, "Shout for Joy!" Be glad and exult. How could he say this? He believed that the people would change, for God was in their midst, ready to save them. John the Baptist came upon the scene at another difficult time. Once again, the Jewish people lived under foreign rule. Many had dishonored themselves by working for the occupying force. John called them to change. Tax collectors: Collect only what is fair. Soldiers: Stop extorting people. Everyone: Share what you have with those who don't have enough. God is in your midst, ready to save you, for the Messiah comes. Rejoice! Even in the darkest of times God is in our midst as well, ready to enter our hearts, ready to save us. Let us change how we live, becoming wheat for the world, and giving sustenance to our neighbor as we look to be gathered into God's kingdom. What can we do to be "wheat for the world," to be sustenance for our neighbor?

The annual Retirement Fund for Religious Collection will be held this weekend. The collection benefits 33,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests. Their religious communities lack adequate retirement funding. The appeal raises about \$30 million each year. This ongoing generosity toward the needs of senior religious is truly heartwarming. We remember all Retired Religious as we take up a collection for their needs. I am continuing the tradition of remembering the retired sisters with a greeting card. I have gotten the list of retired sisters from the IHM community. I have started a tradition of passing the names out at this Advent Mass and I ask that you write a note of thanks for their sacrifices and service to the Church or send them a Christmas card of gratitude.

If you take a tag off of the giving tree to prepare a gift for someone in need it needs to be returned with a gift by December 19, that's next Sunday. This is our yearly Advent exercise to help us in our preparation for Christmas. Please, bring food for the hungry and place it in our Food Boxes. Also, take six minutes a day to use the Little Blue Books. We journey with St. Luke's Gospel during Advent Sundays. He is "Our Lady's Troubadour" the "Joyful Evangelist." Today the Church lights the third of four candles on the Advent Wreath. The color is rose reminding us of the joy of this season. Perhaps you will want to light a candle in your home, too.

Today is the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mary is the Patroness of the Americas under the title of Our Lady of Guadalupe. On his trip to Mexico a few years ago, Pope Francis celebrated Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In his homily that day he spoke of Mary's humility in submitting to God's will. That humility is apparent in the fact that she appeared not to a bishop in a cathedral but to a peasant on a hillside. Our lady asked him to speak to the bishop to see that a church was built in that spot in her honor. The pope noted that, like Mary, Juan Diego had to overcome his own feelings of inadequacy in performing this mission. But he did, and the basilica is now visited by millions of pilgrims each year. After the apparition 6 million Mexicans were baptized and received into the Catholic Church and child sacrifice a practice of the Aztec Indians was ended.

Listening is one of the most powerful and deeply human experiences we can have because it respects and validates what is being said. Everyone has a chance to be heard including those often marginalized or left out, as well as those who have fallen away from the Church, and young people and families who have not returned to the Church community since receiving their sacraments.

For those without a computer, a phone survey can be completed by calling 570-591-5024. Sometime in January, we plan to have an in person gathering in January to capture the thoughts and experiences of all the People of God. Everyone will be welcome to attend. As Pope Francis said in his opening Mass for the Synod on October 10th, "Let us not miss out on the grace-filled opportunities born of encounter, listening and discernment."

#### **Diocese Adds Name to List of Credibly Accused**

Following the release of the Pennsylvania Grand Jury Report in August 2018, Bishop Joseph C. Bambera made a promise that he would be open and transparent in the way that the Diocese of Scranton handles occurrences of child sexual abuse. That commitment remains true.


In August 2018, the Diocese published on its website a list of all clergy, staff and volunteers who had been credibly accused of child sexual abuse. Since that time, additional names have been added to the online list as necessary, with public notification.

The Diocese was recently notified by the Franciscan Friars, Holy Name Province, that the name of a friar who had previously been stationed in ministry within the Diocese was being included on its listing against whom credible sexual abuse/misconduct claims have been made. As a result of this information, the Diocese of Scranton has also decided to add the following name to its original list of credibly accused individuals:


