

# From the Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Parish Family,

How would you feel if you received an invitation today to a simple but free meal, maybe a plate with beans, some bread, and a tall glass of cool water? If you are wealthy, you would likely refuse, for you know you could afford a much more sumptuous meal elsewhere. But if you are having difficulty putting food on your table and your family is starving, this complimentary meal would be a godsend. Exactly: a godsend. Something sent by the grace of God. In Luke's account of the Beatitudes, Jesus shows the crowds both sides of the coin. The hungry will be satisfied, but the satisfied will be hungry. The despairing will be joyful, but the joyful will despair. Jesus is able to preach this for he is literally a godsend, sent by God to save us. In him, we are redeemed. Because of him, we can train our eyes on heaven. As Paul wrote, our hope in Christ is not for this life only. Or to use Jeremiah's imagery from the first reading, we are like trees planted by a stream, stretching out our roots to the living waters Christ brings, for he satisfies us with joy, with plenty and ultimately, with the kingdom of God. How can we be a godsend for others?

Today is World Marriage Sunday which honors husband and wife as the foundation of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life. Consider planning a special date night with your spouse to celebrate this special day. It falls conveniently close to the feast of St. Valentine!! Prayer for Married Couples:

"Almighty and eternal God, You blessed the union of married couples so that they might reflect the union of Christ with his Church; look with kindness on them. Renew their marriage covenant, increase your love in them, and strengthen their bond of peace so that, with their children, they may always rejoice in the gift of your blessing. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."

And now I would like to reflect on Vision 2030. The Vision is to create Parish Communities rooted in the Life of Jesus Christ. We have some challenges we must address to ensure the church is vibrant and present to future generations. A lot has changed not only in society – but also in the Diocese of Scranton during its more than 150 year history. By working together, we hope to strengthen the most vibrant expressions of parish life and to embrace the unavoidable changes which require us to respond in new ways.

As members of the Church of Scranton, we must work in a way that we best live out our baptismal calling in both a world – and local environment - that continues to change. We must continue to respond to the needs of the People of God with changing resources and opportunities. We have fewer parish members supporting the mission of the Church today. Long before the Covid-19 pandemic impacted parishes, regular weekend Mass attendance had been on the decline. The number of parish members who are registered in all parishes of the Diocese of Scranton dropped more than 16% between 2014 and 2020. The total number of Baptisms, First Communions and Confirmations in the Diocese of Scranton also dropped during this time period. In 2020, the diocese identified that there are more than 317,000 Catholic individuals within the 11 county territory. Only 224,075 are registered in a Catholic church. So 92,925 are not currently practicing the catholic faith. This challenge needs to be addressed. Vision 2030 is attempting to do that.

Please remember to go to the Diocesan Website and press Synod. The Holy Father is waiting for your response to the questions posed to the people in the pews.

## Reflections

#### Priests & Marriage Counseling

Question: How can a priest counsel people about marriage when he has never been married?

Answer:

If a marriage counselor is in a bad marriage does that mean that he or she will be a bad counselor? If one's counseling ability depended upon first-hand experience, would that require counselors to be perfect before they can help others? Obviously not. Some of the skills necessary to help others do come out of personal life experience. But you don't need personal, first-hand experience in order to understand something. We would not think that a doctor, who is an oncologist, would not be able to treat cancer because he himself has never been sick. We also would not expect every doctor to treat cancer. It is the same with priests.

Essentially marriage is a relationship and we've all been involved in different kinds of relationships: in our family, with our friends, and with God. And so counseling people about marriage is really helping them to look at the issues that really are part of their relationship, finding ways to better understand themselves in relationship to one another and in relationship to God. In many ways a priest's training, background, and experience, as well as his personal knowledge of many different relationships in families and couples, gives him a broad background from which to draw upon. Most priests are quite capable of helping couples prepare for marriage and discussing the issues that are important as they begin their life together. And they do not do it alone. With the help of married couples and specially trained counselors, most parishes offer a very good preparation for the sacrament of marriage.

We all know that there are times when life can feel, as Jeremiah writes, empty and wasted. There are moments when we think we resemble a barren bush, thirsting in the desert sun.

That's why it is imperative for us to know the location of our water source. I promise you, it's closer than you think. God never planted a seed in barren ground.

For me, it's the Mass. Going to Mass is where I find total peace and renewal. I don't have any great theological explanation for this — Mass is simply where I can truly rest in God for a time, where nothing and no one in the world can touch me. And wouldn't you know it, it's in the toughest times that I need Mass the most — that my roots stretch harder for that water.
