



SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Baptism Please call the Parish Office to register for a Baptism and arrange a meeting with one of the priests. Families having a first child baptized will be asked to attend Bap-

tismal Instructions at St. Rose Rectory. Baptisms are held at 12:30 pm at St. Rose on the first Sunday of the month and at Mt. Carmel on the third Sunday of the month. **Note:** Baptismal dates will be scheduled only after the necessary paperwork is completed.

<u>Confirmation</u> is administered yearly to 8th grade students in our CCD program and those students attending Parochial Schools. Children wishing to receive Confirmation must be enrolled and participating in the CCD program for two years before they are eligible to receive the sacrament.

<u>Marriage</u> To complete the necessary paperwork, couples are asked to contact the Parish Office at least one full year in advance of the proposed marriage date.

<u>**Reconciliation**</u> is celebrated at times listed on the cover or by appointment by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Anointing of the Sick</u> Whenever a family member has become seriously sick or is hospitalized, please contact the Parish Office to schedule an anointing.* Please note - Until further notice, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, requests for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick should be only in "imminent danger of death" and home communion visitations are suspended.

<u>Monthly Visitations</u> Homebound parishioners who wish to receive the Eucharist on a monthly basis are encouraged to contact the Parish Office to schedule a visit.

Seminarian Reflections – Gabriel said, "Hail, full of grace!"

Dear parishioners,

I once heard a Catholic priest reflecting on the scene we hear in this week's Gospel. "Imagine," he posed, "how excited the angel Gabriel must have been to bring the message to Mary that she would conceive in her womb the very Son of God." Perhaps too often we imagine the scene of the Annunciation as being overly pious, and maybe even a bit boring. We have heard the story hundreds, if not thousands, of times before. Yet, the more we think about it, and the more we really reflect on the language given to us in Luke's Gospel (Luke 1), it was one of the most exciting moments in history.

Think about it...we hear of many emotions during this scene. The angel Gabriel greets Mary, "Hail, full of grace!" What excitement! Also, we hear that Mary was greatly troubled and pondered. We hear a declaration not to be afraid. Mary heard from Gabriel about the promise made to King David that his own ancestor would have an eternal kingdom (which we heard in the first reading). Mary was well aware what this promise would entail. She finds out that her elder relative is miraculously pregnant. And, she humbly replies to the angel, despite all these varying emotions, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

It is such a mysterious scene. It is a heavenly scene that is hard to wrap our minds around. However, it is also a very human scene. We see the confusion. We see the perplexities. We see the joys! Why shouldn't it be an exciting scene? After all, it was the beginning of God among us, Emmanuel.

Blessing of a Christmas Manger or Nativity Scene



In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223.

When the Christmas manger is set up in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another family member.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord. **R/. Who made heaven and earth.** One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scrip-

ture, for example, Luke 2:1 (lines 1-8) or Isaiah 7:10 (lines 10 -15, the birth of Emmanuel). Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The leader prays with hands joined: God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have made manifest your love: when our need for a Savior was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord,

bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. R/. Amen. —From Catholic Household Blessings & Prayers
