

My Dear People,

The fall season and new school year are right around the corner, which means it's time once again to reconvene the Joint Parish Pastoral Council. The council has had the summer off to spend time with family and enjoy a break. While our council has fairly new members on it, we will be seeking to add two members from St. Rose and two members from Our Lady of Mount Carmel this September.

Starting today and continuing over the next few weeks, there will be a description on what makes a good



The first and most important step in the pastoral planning process is selecting leaders from among our faith communities to be the pastoral planners or the stewards of planning who will serve our parishes in this unique ministry of leadership. Council members serve as a wisdom group in a consultative capacity to the pastor. They commit to being Servant Leaders who accept a shared responsibility to enrich parish life and bring to fruition God's plan for our communities of faith.

The Parish Pastoral Council is made up of persons who are not representative leaders of designated committees or ministries within the parish, but who are representatives of the wider parish community. They are encouraged to focus their attention on the needs of all members and not a singular group.

This ministry of leadership is a call by the community, done in openness and trust, to assist the pastor in assessing current parish life and provide vision for the future. When wearing the "hat" of a council member, you then accept the role of a "visionary planner" looking to the horizon for the future of our parish communities.

The commitment will involve one monthly meeting and possible sub-committee meetings. If you feel you are being called to serve our parishes in this capacity, in early September there will be a form to complete to self-nominate. The names will then be brought to council, prayed over, and discussed within the group. The council will make its final selection of candidates, and new members who are selected will be welcomed at the October meeting.

Thank you for your willingness to consider helping our parish communities in this important work. Please continue to pray for the selection process and for an openness to the Holy Spirit, working within our midst, to call forth candidates.







#### St. Rose of Lima | August 23

Born Isabel Flores de Olivia in April 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, Saint Rose of Lima took the name Rose at her confirmation in 1597. Legend holds that she received this nickname as an infant because a servant saw her face transformed into a rose.

Even as a child Saint Rose was dedicated to Christ. Growing up she made many secret penances. And when she was old enough to be married, deterred suitors by cutting off her hair and rubbing pepper on face to make it blister. She took a vow of chastity even though her parents wished her to marry. She fasted many times a week and permanently abstained from meat.

Eventually her parents gave in and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic, although she was not permitted to live in a convent. Saint Rose undertook severe penances, allowing herself only two hours of sleep a night in order to have more time to pray, wearing a heavy silver crown with spikes on the inside imitating Christ's crown of thorns, and even burning her own hands. However, she also cared for the sick and hungry, and sold her beautiful embroidery and fine lace, as well as flowers she grew to help raise funds for the poor.

She died at the age of 31 on August 24, 1617. Pope Clement X canonized her in 1671, she was the first saint of the New World, born in the Americas. Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines.


