Wedding... Please call the Rectory at least six months prior to the wedding date, if not confirmed, one year.





Lessons from the Holy Family...

The Holy Family at first glance seems to be a peaceful and beautiful example of family life. But Mary and Joseph actually sacrificed all their plans and expectations as a couple to welcome and raise Jesus, their gift from God, under circumstances they never imagined—a virgin birth. Over and over, they found themselves inconvenienced—traveling while 9 months pregnant, labor and delivery in a stable, fleeing for their lives to Egypt with a newborn, or frantically worrying if Jesus was lost when he was in the Temple.

The Holy Family lived through the same stresses that every human family experiences. At times they had to dig deep and ask for God's help even though they were the parents of our Savior. They show us that no family is perfect and all we can do is try to always love unconditionally to the best of our ability. In doing that we are raising our families up to God and asking Him to bless them and keep them in His care. If we all make a deliberate effort to do that every day, the world will certainly become a better place--one family at a time.
