

REFLECT

FIRST READING

In his account of the passion narrative, we hear how Luke emphasizes the innocence of Jesus, noting both Pilate and Herod (Antipas) find Jesus innocent. Why do you think Luke highlights the verdict of Jesus as "not guilty" of any capital crime?



CATHOLIC EDUCATION: BRINGING FAMILIES TO THE CHURCH

Pope Benedict XVI in his speech to Catholic educators at Catholic University in 2012 stated "First and foremost every Catholic educational institution is a place to encounter the living God who in Jesus Christ reveals his transforming love and truth." Later in the same speech he goes on to say "The church's primary mission of evangelization, in which educational institutions play a crucial role, is consonant with a nation's fundamental aspiration to develop a society truly worthy of the human person's dignity." Evangelization, leading our students and families to know and love God, is ever in our minds at St. Michael School.

Over the years we have noticed that the school students quite often lead their families back to the Church. We have seen many families who have drifted away from the Church begin to attend Mass with their children more consistently, quite often at the initial request of the children. Students who have been baptized as babies, but never followed up with other sacraments, ask to receive their sacraments. Children who were baptized in other faiths make their profession of faith and receive their Catholic sacraments with their class.

And then there are the even more special occurrences, children who have never been baptized who ask to become members of the Catholic faith. In the past two years alone, nine students from the school have been baptized by Father Perkins and became members of our faith. These children were drawn to Jesus through their religion classes, through attendance at Mass and liturgies, and, through being members of the faith community that is St. Michael School.

At this time of the Liturgical year, as we are welcoming new members into our faith at Easter, we are also thankful for the children that we have welcomed, and will continue to welcome through St. Michael School. And we will continue our mission to form students who will be able to develop the society espoused by Pope Benedict.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Pope St. John Paul II rightly taught, "To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says, even when it runs contrary to what others are saying. It means rejecting the lure of sin, however attractive it may be, in order to set out on a difficult path of Gospel virtues." Acceptance, rejection, suffering, betraval, fear, reluctance, persecution, and painful, undeserved and unjust death are all played out in dramatic fashion today. Jesus spoke of God's unconditional love, mercy, and forgiveness. Who doesn't like hearing about love, especially God's? Jesus did not have backs turned on him, face intense suffering, and succumb to a horrific death because he spoke of God's love. All of those things occurred because of the implications of actually believing in God's love.

God's love comes with an intimate and equal bond with love of neighbor. This moves the believer outward to truly see tive, and self-serving look very attractheir brothers and sisters as equals and compels them to work for a world that mirrors God's kingdom: a world based
