Dear Friends,

Two weeks ago, we began a new Church (or Liturgical) Year with the First Sunday of Advent.

From this Sunday, all through till Pentecost next year, the Church takes us through her Liturgy from the preparation of the Messiah's Birth to the glorious consummation of His Paschal Mystery.



The Season of Advent also is a special time of spiritual preparation for Christmas. In former days it had the character of a "little Lent" (only 4 Sundays as opposed to 5 weeks): a season of fasting and repentance, preparing the soul for Christmas as we do for Easter.

It was also a time that included the ancient penitential Winter Ember Days and the great Vigils of the Immaculate Conception and of Christmas Eve, where Catholics used to observe fasting and abstinence from meat. The only remnant of that now is the purple color of the vestments and of the Advent Candles (lightened on the Third or "Gaudete" Sunday of Advent by the use of rose vestments).

The name "Advent" is the Latin for "coming." We remember three "advents" of the Lord:

- The first coming of the Lord in history, as the Child of Bethlehem.
- The second coming at the end of time to "judge the living and the dead," as we say in the Creed.
- The middle, or "daily" coming of the Lord in His Word, Sacraments, and daily graces and opportunities to serve Him in those around us.

The Advent Wreath has 4 colored candles, symbolizing the traditional 4000 years that is said to have elapsed from the creation of Adam to the birth of Christ. The violet color is a reminder that Advent, though not really a pre-Christmas Lent, is a time perhaps of serious reflection and straightening out our lives, if need be, to worthily celebrate Christmas. "The Lord is near," we often hear in Advent. Indeed He is! Everyday, He is near. Let us all try to live with that thought in our minds and hearts not only now, but every day of our lives.

Mass Cards at St. Matthew's

St. Matthew's Parish offers two types of Mass Cards:

- Announced Masses: As the name implies this is a Mass set for a specific date and time and the name of the person(s) for whom the Mass is offered is published in the bulletin and announced at the Mass. These are particularly suitable for those families or individuals who will attend the actual Mass on the day appointed. While anyone can arrange for an Announced Mass, their number is necessarily limited by the number of public Masses offered in a year.
- Unannounced Masses: These are Masses that will be offered in the coming year but at an unspecified date, time and place. The priests of the Parish offer these Masses during retreat, vacation, and other days in which they do not have a public Mass. Mass Cards are issued for these Masses with the name of the person(s) written in the card but without any specific promised date or time. This category might be suitable for cases where the family of the named person(s) are not parishioners, live some distance away, or would not otherwise be able to attend a Mass here on a set day or time.

The receptionist will help you in arranging either or both of these Masses and the different offerings for each category.

Eucharistic Piety:

This Parish has long offered opportunities for special Eucharistic Adoration in the form of "Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament;" i.e., the Host is exposed to view in the monstrance for prayer. Currently we have one such Holy Hour, Tuesday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30 AM in the church.

Traditionally, the Church has always encouraged the less formal and more flexible form of Eucharistic Adoration known as "a visit to the Blessed Sacrament" as the primary way to adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. In this parish the main church is open for basically 12 hours every day. I notice with pleasure many people "dropping by" to be with Our Lord in the Tabernacle for some time, or only even for a few moments. Adoration of the Lord in His Eucharistic Presence reserved in the Tabernacle is always beneficial for those who avail themselves of it, no matter even of short duration.

About The Types of Catholic Wedding Ceremonies

There are two forms of Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding or Nuptial Mass: Often referred to as a "full Mass," it is the celebration of the Mass with the wedding ceremony inserted in the middle of the Liturgy. It presupposes both parties are practicing Catholics and receiving Holy Communion after a proper spiritual preparation.

The Wedding Ceremony: This has all the elements of the above (music, readings, vows, etc.) but without the celebration of Mass. This form is suitable for general congregations and is of shorter duration than the above.

PLEASE NOTE: Nuptial Masses are NOT celebrated on Sundays. The ONLY exception is when a visiting priest is invited by the family, approved by the Pastor and is willing to offer a Nuptial Mass on Sunday.



Holy Hour of Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in a solemn form is held every Tuesday after the 9:00 AM Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES

We are still registering children for the Winter Program—it is never too late! All students whether being taught here on site or at home must be registered so they get credit for this calendar year. If you don't have the registration form, you can come into the Religion office and we will give you one.

When registering a new student, 1st thru 8th grade, you must come into the Religion Office on the second floor of the Parish Center, Monday through Thursday anytime from 12 to 4:00PM and bring a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate when you come. The fee of \$175.00 per child is due at that time. Please enter through the 'Gym Entrance' door at the end of the Parish Center Building.

For safety reasons, children in 1st & 2nd grade must be signed in and out by a parent or adult. Students in the 6th, 7th & 8th grades can be dropped off at the Gym door and come in on their own but must be signed out each week by a parent or adult.

Special Notes: Classes are suspended for the Christmas Holidays from Thursday, December 23rd, thru Sunday, January 2, 2022. We resume classes on Monday January 3, 2022.

**Eighth Grade A-L Session 1 Confirmation Students: Gown measurement is Monday, December 13th, 7PM during class. Completed Confirmation packets and fee are due back in the Religion Office by Friday, December 17th. Eighth grade Session 1 ends on Monday, December 20th. Sixth and Seventh grade Session 1 ends on Tuesday, December 21st.

Session 2 M-Z for middle school grades 6, 7 & 8 begins on January 3, 2022. Eighth grade attends Monday night, January 3rd; Sixth and Seventh grades come on Tuesday night, January 4th.

My Dear Parishioners.




On Nov. 30, I was blessed to attend the inspiring Installation of Bishop Brennan as Bishop of Brooklyn. Bishop Brennan was raised on Long Island and often came to St. Matthew's to attend the Diocesan Pastoral Council which had met here for several years. He had been ordained an Auxiliary Bishop in our Diocese in 2012. Since he was a young boy, he had been a good friend of Msgr. McDonald. His installation was held at \St. Joseph's Co-Cathedral Church on Pacific Street in Brooklyn. I hadn't been inside that Church in more than 60 years. It is absolutely beautiful. 

Focus on Religious Freedom

"Religious freedom is the lifeblood of the American people, the cornerstone of American government." - Cardinal Timothy Dolan

What, Exactly, is Religious Freedom?
And How Does This Affect Public Christmas Displays?

Religious freedom protects people's right to live, speak, and act according to their beliefs, peacefully and publicly. It protects their ability to seek the truth about God and live according to those beliefs. Religious freedom is more than the "freedom to worship" at a synagogue, church, or mosque. No other nation has America's robust protection of religious freedom in a Bill of Rights.

(1) Sadly, in recent decades, some government actions have encroached on this God given and Constitutional freedom.

The U.S. Supreme Court rejected the idea that the government should or could compel any citizen to adopt any official belief in its 1943 decision, WV State Board of Ed.v. Barnette. They wrote, "If there is any fixed star in our constitutional constellation, it is that no official, high or petty, can prescribe what shall be orthodox in politics, nationalism, religion, or other matters of opinion to force citizens to confess by word or act their faith therein." (2)

Since the principles of religious freedom prevent the cultural majority from using the power of the state to impose their beliefs on others, both religious and nonreligious alike, the government cannot become so powerful that it can tell people what to think and how to act. (3) This is especially important to know during this Christmas/Hanukkah holiday.

"The U.S. Supreme Court and numerous federal appeals courts have recognized that government entities may recognize Christmas as a holiday and may maintain Christmas displays that include both religious and secular symbols." (4)

"Publicly sponsored Nativity scenes on public property are constitutional, especially when the display includes other secular symbols of the holiday. In fact, removing only the religious symbols of the holiday display would demonstrate hostility toward religion, which the First Amendment forbids," said Liberty Counsel. (5)




