

Dear Friends,

Some years ago, I departed from my usual preaching style and wrote out the following semi-poetic reflection as my homily at Easter. I offer it here, in the typography of a conversation.



It was the morning of the world now...but ...as yet...the world did not know it..

It seemed to the 'world'...that the "world' was safe....

Another Messiah...another imposter...history...

The Death was real alright, no doubt about that....

Scourging...nails...plaited thorns...the Roman cross...the blood...the Seven Words...the final shudder...the final cry...then...for good measure a Roman pilum in the side...must've pierced the pericardium...all that blood and clear fluid...that was it...wasn't it?

There was that oddly troubling darkening of Day...the rumbling of earth....the strange coincidence of how the Temple's inner curtain separated....the crazy stories of open tombs and walking dead...But...there was a Tomb... and two of the Sanhedrin made sure it was all done proper-like...Odd..NOW they come forward?... after He was Dead?....well...you know how "religious people" are....

But...it was the morning...THE morning...and it was growing light....

More weeping women...back to the Tomb....finish the job of preparation...now that the Sabbath was over...

Open?....empty?....HOW????

They enter...the winding sheet askew...no body....Then...the MEN...can't look at them....

"Why seek ye here amongst the dead for One Who is Living?"

He is not HERE...well....THAT they could see...after all....LIVING?...
RISEN?....

But....don't we ALL know that DEAD is DEAD????

Isn't it that there is nothing more certain than that Death is final?....

"Remember...He told you...remember?...He told you..."

REMEMBER!!!!...

It comes flooding back...Yes...yes....but....but....we thought he was...?

KIDDING????

No....He Who is Truth...told you....me... the Truth....

It can't be...it IS!....

Off they run...these women...with their confusing names...Now...which "Mary" is which?...

Off they run....

To the Eleven...depleted now by one....the Man with the Plan...proud like many men who think their sin is much too great for God to forgive....tragedy...the Potter's Field....

The Eleven...behind locked doors...quiet...ashamed...confused...the "Rock" is back...faithful now...Yeh...big help he was in the Garden!...well....where else can we go?...WHO has the words of Eternal Life except...the One...who is DEAD?....they sit there...fearful at a knock on the door....

The Tomb empty?...Two men in white?????

Come on now...really....They said what?...when the Master was with us in Galilee...well... yes...we do remember that now... but...but....

Perhaps it was the deeply hurt and pragmatic Thomas who snapped "NONSENSE!!!!"... and stormed out wrapped in his own sad darkness into the World's Morning...

The Fisherman goes tho'...after all...he has to keep them together...even after...the denials... He runs...probably runs with the rolling gait of a landed fisherman ...bends down...the clothes!...but...wrapped up?...what kind of grave robber would leave behind that cloth...but wrap it up?...Odd...odd.....He wonders....wanders....back....

The Dawn would come...the Voice...the soft call to the Magdelene...then....the Appearance... Alive...wishing them Peace...yet....the wounds....those wounds!... never to be gone...always the Sign of The Sacrificed God....always there...always....they would see Him....fear....rejoice...cling....even our good Thomas would receive his tender but firm challenge...See...Touch!...."Be not unbelieving but believing!"....

He told us...didn't He...?

Yes....of all the world's tombs...only Two are empty because the One buried in it got up...and walked away...or...rather...rose....

Only two...

The other one?....Whose is it?

Well...there IS that other scene not recorded....too private...too intimate...but...it surely HAD to happen....

While the women and disciples rush around....

Somewhere in the early Dawn...a meeting occurs...

We almost cannot bear to imagine it...but it surely HAD to happen...

Somewhere in Jerusalem...

Three years before...pensive..loving...determined...He who is the Sacrificed God...and yet is The Son of A Mother...said farewell....



Mass Cards at St. Matthew's

- St. Matthew's Parish offers two types of Mass Cards:
- Announced Masses: As the name implies this is a Mass set for a specific date and time and the name of the person(s) for whom the Mass is offered is published in the bulletin and announced at the Mass. These are particularly suitable for those families or individuals who will attend the actual Mass on the day appointed. While anyone can arrange for an Announced Mass, their number is necessarily limited by the number of public Masses offered in a year.
- Unannounced Masses: These are Masses that will be offered in the coming year but at an unspecified date, time and place. The priests of the Parish offer these Masses during retreat, vacation, and other days in which they do not have a public Mass. Mass Cards are issued for these Masses with the name of the person(s) written in the card but without any specific promised date or time. This category might be suitable for cases where the family of the named person(s) are not parishioners, live some distance away, or would not otherwise be able to attend a Mass here on a set day or time.

The receptionist will help you in arranging either or both of these Masses and the different offerings for each category.

The receptionist desk will be "womanned" Monday through Thursday from 9 AM to 1 PM for routine parish business and Mass Cards. On Friday there will be more limited service. Please call ahead when in doubt - 631-499-8520. The Parish Center is not open on a general basis, at this time due to the current public health crisis.

Eucharistic Piety:

This Parish has long offered opportunities for special Eucharistic Adoration in the form of "Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament;" i.e., the Host is exposed to view in the monstrance for prayer. Currently we have one such Holy Hour, Tuesday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30 AM in the church.

Traditionally, the Church has always encouraged the less formal and more flexible form of Eucharistic Adoration known as "a visit to the Blessed Sacrament" as the primary way to adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. In this parish the main church is open for basically 12 hours every day. I notice with pleasure many people "dropping by" to be with Our Lord in the Tabernacle for some time, or only even for a few moments.

Adoration of the Lord in His Eucharistic Presence reserved in the Tabernacle is always beneficial for those who avail themselves of it, no matter even of short duration.

Parish Policies

Funerals:

As before, families who have to plan a Catholic Funeral Mass are advised to bear in mind that the Funeral Mass is both a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and a Liturgy that has its own rules and customs. The best place for naturally warm, wide-ranging, and emotional family remembrances or eulogies is at the Wake, NOT at the Funeral Mass. It is the long standing policy of this Parish that NO such remembrances will be done at the Funeral Mass. If there is no Wake, the family may deliver the eulogy at the cemetery or at a subsequent family meal or gathering.

Weddings: There are two forms of the Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding Ceremony:

This has all the festive elements of a full wedding: music, readings, the vows, the Nuptial Blessing, etc. This is the most common form of the Catholic wedding and is often the most practical and manageable for most families. It is by no means a lesser or "second class" ceremony than the following.

The Nuptial Mass:

This is a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with reception of Holy Communion with the wedding ceremony in the middle of the Liturgy. The meaning and inner truth of the Nuptial Mass leads to the following Parish policy: a Nuptial Mass will only be celebrated if both Bride and Groom are practicing Catholics, or intend to become observably practicing Catholics PRIOR to the wedding; and who are NOT already cohabiting as if they were already husband and wife. If they are, they must separate their living arrangements PRIOR to the wedding.

Nuptial Masses are not celebrated on Sundays unless offered by a visiting priest upon the permission of the Parish Pastor.

No one should feel obliged to request a Nuptial Mass who are not able to observe the above requirements. As they say: "no hard feelings." A Wedding Ceremony is recommended in those circumstances with proper Pre-Cana preparation and guidance.

Liturgical Minister Training - Spring 2022

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. **Lector training** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

Jeremy Forrester was born with a twisted body, a slow mind and a terminal disease.

At age 12, he was still in second grade, in a class of 19 children and seemingly unable to learn. His teacher Doris, often became impatient with his squirming, drooling and making grunting sounds, yet at times, he spoke clearly, as if a spot of light penetrated his brain. Most of the time, he just irritated his teacher. Doris called Jeremy's parents for a consultation and told them that Jeremy really belonged in a special school because he was causing a distraction and it wasn't fair to the other 18 students. While Ms. Forrester cried softly, her husband explained that there were no schools of that kind locally and would be a terrible shock for Jeremy to be taken out of this school, and be separated from those who love him. "We know he likes it here. Doris thought for a long time after they left. As she stared at the snow outside, it's coldness seemed to seep into her soul. She wanted to sympathize with them. After all, their only child has a terminal illness, but it wasn't fair to her other students. He would never learn to read or write, so why waste any more time trying. But guilt washed over her. "Here I am complaining when my problems are nothing compared to that poor family. Lord, help me to be more patient with Jeremy." One day, he limped to her desk, dragging his leg and said, "Mrs. Miller, I love you." The other students giggled and teacher's face turned red with embarrassment. She gave no reply.

Spring came and Doris told the students the story of Jesus and His death and resurrection. To emphasize the idea of new life, she gave each child an empty plastic egg. "Now children, take this home and bring it back tomorrow with something inside that shows new life. Do you understand?" "Yes," they responded, all except Jeremy. He listened intently, his eyes never leaving her face. She wondered, did he really understand what she said about Jesus death and His resurrection? Maybe she should call the parents and have them help Jeremy with the project. That night, with so many things to attend to, she completely forgot to call.

Next morning, the children placed their eggs in the basket on teacher's desk. Time to open the eggs! In the first, there was a flower. Oh yes, a flower is a sign of new life, and when it peeks through the ground, we know that spring is here. The next egg contained a plastic butterfly. Doris held it up and said, "We all know that a caterpillar changes into a beautiful butterfly, and that's new life too." Doris opened the next one and gasped! It was empty! Surely it must be Jeremy's. He didn't understand the instructions. If only she had remembered to call the parents. Because she didn't want to embarrass him, she set the egg aside and reached for another. Suddenly, Jeremy spoke up in a perfectly toned voice, "Mrs. Miller, aren't you going to talk about my egg?" "But Jeremy, your egg was empty." "Yes, but Jesus' tomb was empty too," he said. Time stood still!! When she could speak again, Doris asked, "Do you know why the tomb was empty?" "Oh yes,

Jesus was killed and put in there. Then His Father raised Him up and that's how Easter started." The bell rang, the children ran to recess and Doris cried. The cold inside her melted completely away.

Three months later, Jeremy passed away. Those who came to pay their respects, were surprised to see 19 Easter Eggs on top of his casket, all of them EMPTY.

FOR CLIENTS RECEIVING SNAP OR TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE

In February, OTDA distributed a portion of PEAF (Pandemic Emergency Assistance Fund) funds to provide to one-time cash payments to families that have a child under the age of three and are enrolled in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance (TA). Families received \$140 per eligible child to help cover the cost of diapers.

In April, OTDA will issue one-time cash payments for food assistance to SNAP and TA households that include both an adult who is 55 or older and a child who is 17 or younger. These households will receive \$730 per eligible older adult.

Additional Emergency Allotments (EA) will be issued to all SNAP households in New York State in March. Distribution began on March 7 and will continue throughout the month. SNAP Emergency Allotments are approved by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) on a month-by-month basis and will continue until the public health emergency is lifted in our nation.

The diaper supplement and food assistance payments will be issued to households' EBT cash account. Families must access their EBT cash account within 90 days of receiving the payment or the cash will be removed from the account. Catholic Charities was kind enough to send us this information.

Religious Re-Awakening and Revival Coming Soon

The Bishops of the United States (USCCB) are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist called, "Eucharistic Revival: My Flesh for the Life of the World." Religious freedom in America, a fundamental and foundational right, guaranteed in the Constitution, protects this initiative to "start a fire" (1), beginning on June 19, 2022, and culminating in December, 2024.

The Bishops propose to invite U.S. Catholics of all ages to become part of a national movement "to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist," said Bishop Andrew Cozzens, chairman of the USCCB Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis. (2) This revival could be a time of healing for the entire church and a reawakening of understanding of the sacrament of the Eucharist. (3)

"One of the signs that the Holy Spirit is behind this is the incredible reception that so many different apostolates and movements have given to this idea," said Bishop Cozzens. (4) The development of the plan was spurred by a 2019 Pew Research study that found only about 30% of U.S. Catholics believe the Church's teaching that the Eucharist is truly the body and blood of Christ.

"I really believe our country and our world needs revival right now. In fact, each of us do. We get revived by the Sacraments and Sacramentals we use. We get revived by each other, our families, and thousands of (faithful) men and women...", wrote Fr. Richard Heilman. (5) This Eucharistic Revival within the Catholic Church could be the impetus for a national faith revival and a return to the vibrant religious liberty inherent in our Judeo-Christian roots.




