Mass Cards at St. Matthew's

St. Matthew's Parish offers two types of Mass Cards:

- Announced Masses: As the name implies this is a Mass set for a specific date and time and the name of the person(s) for whom the Mass is offered is published in the bulletin and announced at the Mass. These are particularly suitable for those families or individuals who will attend the actual Mass on the day appointed. While anyone can arrange for an Announced Mass, their number is necessarily limited by the number of public Masses offered in a year.
- Unannounced Masses: These are Masses that will be offered in the coming year but at an unspecified date, time and place. The priests of the Parish offer these Masses during retreat, vacation, and other days in which they do not have a public Mass. Mass Cards are issued for these Masses with the name of the person(s) written in the card but without any specific promised date or time. This category might be suitable for cases where the family of the named person(s) are not parishioners, live some distance away, or would not otherwise be able to attend a Mass here on a set day or time.

The receptionist will help you in arranging either or both of these Masses and the different offerings for each category.

Parish Office Hours:

The receptionist desk will be "womanned" Monday through Thursday from 9 AM to 1 PM for routine parish business and Mass Cards. On Friday there will be more limited service. Please call ahead when in doubt - 631-499-8520. The Parish Center is not open on a general basis, at this time due to the current public health crisis.



LOOKING AHEAD

Parents may have to pick up their Communion child early from school as there is only one rehearsal for each Communion and we begin promptly at 3:00pm. School districts are notified of our First Holy Communion rehearsal schedule.



Parish Policies

Funerals:

As before, families who have to plan a Catholic Funeral Mass are advised to bear in mind that the Funeral Mass is both a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and a Liturgy that has its own rules and customs. The best place for naturally warm, wide-ranging, and emotional family remembrances or eulogies is at the Wake, NOT at the Funeral Mass. It is the long standing policy of this Parish that NO such remembrances will be done at the Funeral Mass. If there is no Wake, the family may deliver the eulogy at the cemetery or at a subsequent family meal or gathering.

Weddings: There are two forms of the Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding Ceremony:

This has all the festive elements of a full wedding: music, readings, the vows, the Nuptial Blessing, etc. This is the most common form of the Catholic wedding and is often the most practical and manageable for most families. It is by no means a lesser or "second class" ceremony than the following.

The Nuptial Mass:

This is a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with reception of Holy Communion with the wedding ceremony in the middle of the Liturgy. The meaning and inner truth of the Nuptial Mass leads to the following Parish policy: a Nuptial Mass will only be celebrated if both Bride and Groom are practicing Catholics, or intend to become observably practicing Catholics PRIOR to the wedding; and who are NOT already cohabiting as if they were already husband and wife. If they are, they must separate their living arrangements PRIOR to the wedding.

Nuptial Masses are not celebrated on Sundays unless offered by a visiting priest upon the permission of the Parish Pastor.

No one should feel obliged to request a Nuptial Mass who are not able to observe the above requirements. As they say: "no hard feelings." A Wedding Ceremony is recommended in those circumstances with proper Pre-Cana preparation and guidance.

Eucharistic Piety: This Parish has long offered opportunities for special Eucharistic Adoration in the form of "Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament;" i.e., the Host is exposed to view in the

monstrance for prayer. Currently we have one such Holy Hour, Tuesday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30 AM in the church.

Traditionally, the Church has always encouraged the less formal and more flexible form of Eucharistic Adoration known as "a visit to the Blessed Sacrament" as the primary way to adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. In this parish the main church is open for basically 12 hours every day. I notice with pleasure many people "dropping by" to be with Our Lord in the Tabernacle for some time, or only even for a few moments.

A WONDERFUL STORY

A relatively young priest is at a hospital visiting some of his parishioners. He is walking down the hallway, and a young nun stops him and asks, "Father, can you go into this room? There's a man on his deathbed. He's been here for days. We've asked priests to go in but he chases everyone away. He doesn't want to talk about Jesus, but he's dying. Could you please visit him?"

The priest goes in and introduces himself to the man. The guy erupts and starts cursing at him. He is so angry: "I don't want anything to do with you, Get out of here." The priest says, "OK" and leaves. The nun is still there and asks the priest to go back in. The priest replies, "He doesn't want anything that I have to offer." "Just give it another try," pleads the nun. The priest reluctantly reenters the room. "I'm not going to ask if you want to go to confession. I'm not going to ask if you want Holy Communion. Is it ok if I just sit here by your bed and pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy?" The old man replies, "I don't care, do whatever you want." The priest sits down and begins softly praying the Chaplet. "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. For the sake of......" Suddenly, the man blurts out, "Stop it!" Startled, the priest asks, "Why? Why do you say that?" Because there is no mercy for me." "Why," asks the priest. "Because twenty-five years ago I was working for the railroad. My job was to lower the guard rail when a train was coming, but one night I was drunk. I didn't lower the crossing guard and a couple and their three children were instantly killed by a train. It was my fault, so there is no mercy for me. I have failed...it is over!" The priest just sits there staring at his rosary. He asks the man, "Where was this?" The man tells him. The priest looks up and says, "Twenty-five years ago my mom and dad were taking my siblings on a trip. I couldn't go with them. In this little town, they approached the train tracks and for some reason, the crossing arm was not lowered, and as they were crossing, the train came and killed them all. I lost my whole family that night." The priest gazes into the man's eyes and says, "My brother, God forgives you, and not only that, I forgive you." The priest asks, "Would you let me hear your confession and give you the Eucharist?" Two days later, the man dies. Mercy wins and the story goes on.

After giving the man Communion, the priest goes in search of the nun. He can't find her, and administration tells him, "We don't employ any nuns at this hospital.

For years, the priest does not know who this nun is. Eventually, he goes to the town of Vilnius, which is where Saint Faustina lived. He goes to the Convent to say Mass for the nuns there. He sees a painting on the wall and says, "I met that nun a few years ago." "No Father, you did not," replies one of the nuns, "she has been dead since 1938." The priest then realizes it was Sister Faustina who told him to go into the man's room, to not accept failure, and asked him to go back in again! Failure is not final when it comes to Jesus.






