

Parish Policies

Funerals:

As before, families who have to plan a Catholic Funeral Mass are advised to bear in mind that the Funeral Mass is both a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and a Liturgy that has its own rules and customs. The best place for naturally warm, wide-ranging, and emotional family remembrances or eulogies is at the Wake, NOT at the Funeral Mass. It is the long standing policy of this Parish that NO such remembrances will be done at the Funeral Mass. If there is no Wake, the family may deliver the eulogy at the cemetery or at a subsequent family meal or gathering.

Weddings: There are two forms of the Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding Ceremony: This has all the festive elements of a full wedding: music, readings, the vows, the Nuptial Blessing, etc. This is the most common form of the Catholic wedding and is often the most practical and manageable for most families. It is by no means a lesser or "second class" ceremony than the following.

The Nuptial Mass: This is a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with reception of Holy Communion with the wedding ceremony in the middle of the Liturgy. The meaning and inner truth of the Nuptial Mass leads to the following Parish policy: a Nuptial Mass will only be celebrated if both Bride and Groom are practicing Catholics, or intend to become observably practicing Catholics PRIOR to the wedding; and who are NOT already cohabiting as if they were already husband and wife. If they are, they must separate their living arrangements PRIOR to the wedding.

Nuptial Masses are not celebrated on Sundays unless offered by a visiting priest upon the permission of the Parish Pastor.

No one should feel obliged to request a Nuptial Mass who are not able to observe the above requirements. As they say: "no hard feelings." A Wedding Ceremony is recommended in those circumstances with proper Pre-Cana preparation and guidance.

Mass Cards at St. Matthew's

- St. Matthew's Parish offers two types of Mass Cards:
- Announced Masses: As the name implies this is a Mass set for a specific date and time and the name of the person(s) for whom the Mass is offered is published in the bulletin and announced at the Mass. These are particularly suitable for those families or individuals who will attend the actual Mass on the day appointed. While anyone can arrange for an Announced Mass, their number is necessarily limited by the number of public Masses offered in a year.
- Unannounced Masses: These are Masses that will be offered in the coming year but at an unspecified date, time and place. The priests of the Parish offer these Masses during retreat, vacation, and other days in which they do not have a public Mass. Mass Cards are issued for these Masses with the name of the person(s) written in the card but without any specific promised date or time. This category might be suitable for cases where the family of the named person(s) are not parishioners, live some distance away, or would not otherwise be able to attend a Mass here on a set day or time.

The receptionist will help you in arranging either or both of these Masses and the different offerings for each category.

This will not ring any bells for my younger readers, but maybe your grandparents can shed some light. For most, this was before your time, but it was a wonderful time to be alive. This special group was born between 1930 and 1946. Now, in 2022, they range in age from 76 to 92. Are you in this group, or know someone "still here?"

Young Energetic Seniors News

You are the smallest group of children born since the early 1900's. You are the last generation climbing out of the great depression, who can remember the winds of war and the impact of a world at war which rattled the structure of our daily lives for years. You are the last to remember ration books for everything from gas, to sugar to shoes, and meat. We grew Victory Gardens. You poured meat fat into cans, brought them to the butcher for maybe a dime or two. If you were lucky, he would gift you with a slice of baloney! You saved the tasty bacon fat for your own cooking. You saw cars up on blocks because tires weren't available. How about the lead pennies, minted because they needed the copper for the "war effort." I remember crying in the street because my Nana contributed my tin playthings to a huge scrap drive for the "war effort." It was a huge pile of pots, pans, and whatever metal they could part with. This was a huge sacrifice, as you can imagine. You can remember milk being delivered to your house each morning. You remember the fruit and vegetable man with his horse drawn wagon coming down your street. You remember the substance that replaced butter and the yellow "pill" that was mixed into it. Us kids usually got that job and it took many hand washings to remove the stain. You are the last to see the gold star flags in the front windows of grieving neighbors whose sons died in the war. Each gold star represented a lost life. You saw the "boys," coming home from the war, build their little houses or go to college thanks to the GI Bill. You are the last generation who spent your childhood without television; instead, you "imagined" what you heard on the radio. Fibber Magee and Molly, Fred Allen, Kate Smith. With no TV until the 1950's, you spent your childhood "playing outside." There was no Little League. On Saturdays, the movies gave you newsreels, sandwiched between cartoons, two double features, and the coming attractions. We were out of our mothers' hair for at least five hours, and it cost only a dime. Telephones were one to a house, and with shared, party lines. (Ask grandma) and it hung on the wall in the kitchen. Computers were called calculators and were hand cranked. Typewriters were powered by pounding fingers, throwing the carriage and changing the ribbon. Internet and Google were words that didn't exist. Newspapers and magazines were written for adults and the news was broadcast on your radio in the evening. The kids had comic books, Superman and their imagination. There was very little in the way of store bought toys and who could afford them anyway? It stimulated us to make our own. Remember the wooden scooters with roller skate wheels? Pure genius! New highways and bridges brought jobs and mobility. The radio network expanded from three stations to thousands. Your parents were suddenly free from the confines of the depression and took advantage of opportunities they had never imagined. You weren't neglected but you weren't today's all-consuming family focus. They were glad! You played by yourselves or with friends till the street lights came on. You entered a world of overflowing plenty and opportunity, a world where you were welcomed, enjoyed yourselves and felt secure in your future, although the depression poverty was deeply remembered. Polio was still a killer. You came of age in the 50's and 60's. Your are the last generation to experience an interlude when there were no threats to our homeland. The war was over and the "Cold War," terrorism, global warming and perpetual economic insecurity had yet to haunt your life. Only your generation can remember both a time of Great War, and a time when our world was secure and full of bright promise. You grew up at the best possible time, a time when the world was getting better ...you are "The Last ones." More than 99% of you are either "retired or have moved on to your "eternal reward" and you feel privileged to have lived "in the best of times." Amen.

It's great being part of the 1% Special Group. I just wish that I realized at the time, that I was so fortunate. God bless us all; those who are gone and to those of us that are still hanging in.

Our next meeting is Thursday, May 5th after the 9:00 am Mass. Please join us and bring a friend.

Remember to pray for everyone, and for our country and those who defend it.
