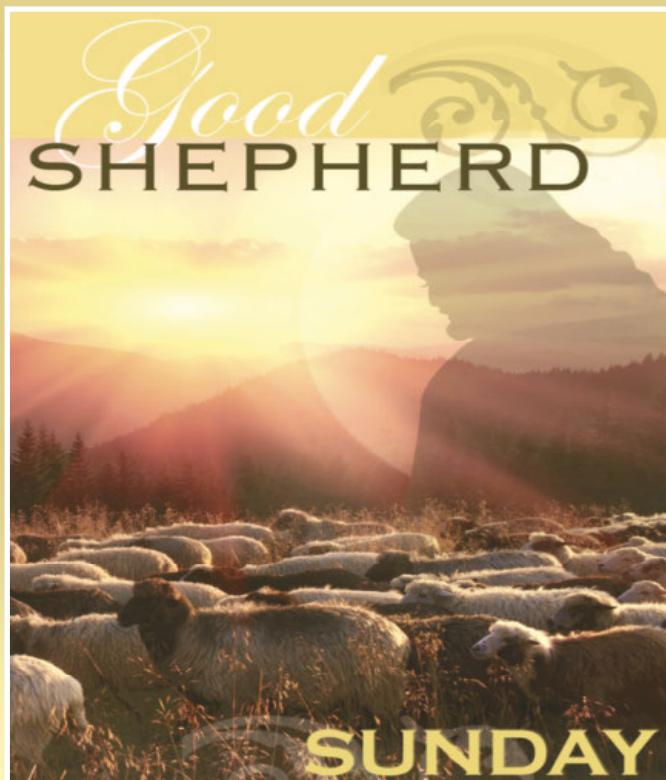

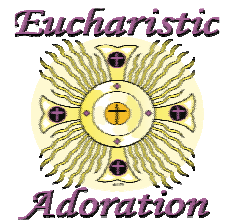

Eucharistic Piety: This Parish has long offered opportunities for special Eucharistic Adoration in the form of "Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament;" i.e., the Host is exposed to view in the

monstrance for prayer. Currently we have one such Holy Hour, Tuesday mornings from 9:30 to 10:30 AM in the church.

Traditionally, the Church has always encouraged the less formal and more flexible form of Eucharistic Adoration known as "a visit to the Blessed Sacrament" as the primary way to adore Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. In this parish the main church is open for basically 12 hours every day. I notice with pleasure many people "dropping by" to be with Our Lord in the Tabernacle for some time, or only even for a few moments.

Adoration of the Lord in His Eucharistic Presence reserved in the Tabernacle is always beneficial for those who avail themselves of it, no matter even of short duration.

On this special day, Mother's Day, we ask you, Lord, to bless and protect all mothers. We ask you to encourage, guide and strengthen all mothers, whether they be pregnant, have young children or even be Grandmothers. Whether they be godmothers or motherly guardians, bless them all their days. Thank you, Lord, for the gift of Motherhood and for the blessing it bestows on us all. New families and new parishioners are encouraged to register with the parish online. Registration forms are also available at the Parish Center.

INSTRUCTIONS IN THE FAITH: Those adults who live in the Dix Hills area and/or those with family in the parish seeking information about becoming a Catholic or completing their Sacraments are invited to contact the Pastor.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK: Those who are seriously ill should request a priest for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

Funerals and Weddings.

Please note some revised Parish policies concerning the above.

Funerals:

As before, families who have to plan a Catholic Funeral Mass are advised to bear in mind that the Funeral Mass is both a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and a Liturgy that has its own rules and customs. The best place for naturally warm, wide-ranging, and emotional family remembrances or eulogies is at the Wake, NOT at the Funeral Mass. It is the long standing policy of this Parish that NO such remembrances will be done at the Funeral Mass. If there is no Wake, the family may deliver the eulogy at the cemetery or at a subsequent family meal or gathering. Also, for various personal or pastoral reasons it is possible to request a Funeral Service rather than the "full" Funeral Mass. This would be conducted in the church, with the usual music and readings, as a Liturgy of the Word concluding with the Final Blessing without Holy Communion.

Weddings:

There are two forms of the Catholic wedding Liturgy:

The Wedding Ceremony: This has all the festive elements of a full wedding: music, readings, the vows, the Nuptial Blessing, etc. This is the most common form of the Catholic wedding and is often the most practical and manageable for most families. It is by no means a lesser or "second class" ceremony than the following.

The Nuptial Mass: a celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass with reception of Holy Communion with the wedding ceremony in the middle of the Liturgy. The meaning and inner truth of the Nuptial Mass leads to the following Parish policy: **a Nuptial Mass will be only be celebrated if both Bride and Groom are practicing Catholics, or intend to become observably practicing Catholics PRIOR to the wedding; and who are NOT already cohabiting as if they were already husband and wife. If they are, they must separate their living arrangements PRIOR to the wedding.**

Nuptial Masses are not celebrated on Sundays unless offered by a visiting priest upon the permission of the Parish Pastor. No one should feel obliged to request a Nuptial Mass who are not able to observe the above requirements. As they say: "no hard feelings." A Wedding Ceremony is recommended in those circumstances with proper Pre-Cana preparation and guidance.

Mass Cards at St. Matthew's

St. Matthew's Parish offers two types of Mass Cards:

- **Announced Masses:** As the name implies this is a Mass set for a specific date and time and the name of the person(s) for whom the Mass is offered is published in the bulletin and announced at the Mass. These are particularly suitable for those families or individuals who will attend the actual Mass on the day appointed. While anyone can arrange for an Announced Mass, their number is necessarily limited by the number of public Masses offered in a year.
- **Unannounced Masses:** These are Masses that will be offered in the coming year but at an unspecified date, time and place. The priests of the Parish offer these Masses during retreat, vacation, and other days in which they do not have a public Mass. Mass Cards are issued for these Masses with the name of the person(s) written in the card but without any specific promised date or time. This category might be suitable for cases where the family of the named person(s) are not parishioners, live some distance away, or would not otherwise be able to attend a Mass here on a set day or time.

The receptionist will help you in arranging either or both of these Masses and the different offerings for each category.

SUMMER PROGRAM

Liturgical Minister Training - Spring 2022

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training. **Lector training** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

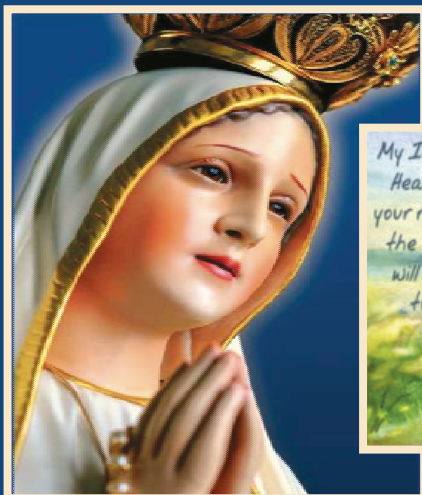

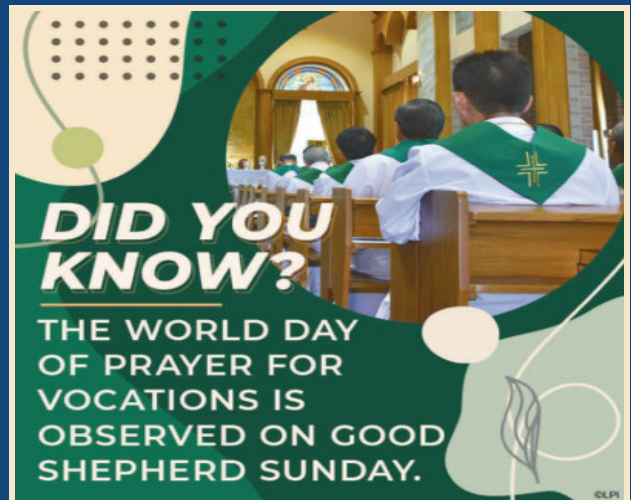

I can't thank you enough for your generous food donations, monetary donations and supermarket gift cards. They have been an enormous help to the many families who come to us for assistance. These people are doing so much better because of people like you.

Also, thank you for the donations you sent to the Missionary Sisters of St. Benedict in Huntington to help the people in the Ukraine. I know, that if you sent the Sisters a donation, they sent you a beautiful thank you note. However, I also feel that I need to thank you since you responded to my plea in the Bulletin.

To me, there are no words to adequately describe this dreadful situation and the immeasurable suffering for people in the Ukraine. Once a week in the evening, my Religious Community, the Sisters of St. Dominic, Amityville, invites all of us and our Associate members to say the Rosary together on Zoom for the people in the Ukraine. PLEASE KEEP PRAYING FOR PEACE THERE.

Now I have another request – this time for the many extremely poor people in Haiti. Charlie Moran is a remarkable man who lives on LI and who has been helping the people of Haiti for many years. He has often stopped to see me at St. Matthew's. He volunteers with the Franciscan Friars of Renewal and has made many visits to Haiti. I have met many of these Priests at benefits that Charlie has sponsored for Haiti.

Each month they ship barrels of food to Haiti. Each barrel costs \$180 to ship and they ship 10 barrels a month, costing \$1,800 a month. This group has also built an orphanage, has helped to feed them and many other people who are extremely poor and starving. They have also started 5 gardens to grow food and built tanks for tilapia ponds to provide more food. Today, Charlie told me that they need 20 jars of peanut butter a week to feed the children.

They also send medical supplies to their mission which is staffed by nurses who volunteer their time and even pay their own airfare to travel to Haiti. I could go on and on about what is needed and the good work done there. However, you can go to the web site of the Friars Suppliers and read more about their tremendous work.

I know that I can always count on you to help where needed. God bless your great goodness. Know that you have my prayers and deep gratitude.

Focus on Religious Freedom

"Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof;" Bill of Rights – 1st Amendment

With Pandemic Coming to an End - Reflections on Religious Liberty

Americans of faith are fortunate to live in a country with robust liberty protections in our Constitution and Bill of Rights First Amendment. However, during these past two-plus years of COVID restrictions on religious activities, including full community worship, and their designation as "non-essential" while many secular activities were designated "essential," invites reflection on religious freedom in America today.

The Becket Law 2021 Religious Freedom Index found "Americans resoundingly believe that religious activities at houses of worship should be considered essential over secular activities."⁽¹⁾ These essential activities during a pandemic include worship and funerals with other religious ceremonies and community service following close behind. "That Americans prioritized religious activities over secular ones during a pandemic provides a stark contrast to the COVID restrictions placed on houses of worship by local and state governments - rules that were both more restrictive and longer-lasting than those placed on many secular venues and businesses," wrote Katie Geary, Becket Fund.⁽²⁾

Many Americans are asking - *What limits does the U.S. Constitution place on the government's suppression of religious liberty during a global health emergency, and what can believers do to secure their right to religious worship?*⁽³⁾ The U.S. Supreme Court has considered these questions based on precedent and the Free Exercise Clause of the First Amendment. We ask - *Why did the founding generation protect religious liberty?*⁽⁴⁾

The history of humanity is intertwined with faith and fundamental religious values that led to the modern understanding of human rights. "Because their ancestors had escaped religious persecution in Europe, the founding generation saw the need to protect religion and viewed morality as necessary to the nation's success," wrote Prof. Anthony Koenc, Dallas College of Law.⁽⁵⁾ The First Amendment placed religion in a special category, uniquely shielding it from government interference.

"No doubt an emergency on the scale of COVID-19 justifies strong measures to protect the public, but we cannot lose sight of the fact that many of these measures are extraordinary assertions of government power that can dramatically constrain our basic freedoms.
