SHEEP WITHOUT A SHEPHERD



Each week I am excited to hear from parishioners about their joy at returning to Mass. For those who have been coming to Mass for a bit, the presence of holy water in the fonts near the entrance or missals in the pews have been additions that are greatly appreciated. Many have observed over the years that "absence makes the heart grow fonder." We do not always appreciate the importance of a person or item until we no longer have access to them.

In today's Gospel, Jesus observes that many people are seemingly lost. They are wandering, like sheep without a shepherd. Sometimes, this is the result of bad shepherding, as we hear in the first reading. Poor decisions have driven good people away. At other times, perhaps it is the obstinance of the people. They do not want to be guided or to listen to others, but nonetheless, have no real plan of their own to follow. Finally, there are times where there are simply not enough leaders. People cannot find connection with each other.

Our parish has begun its tenth year of existence. We hope to celebrate this milestone in a variety of ways in the coming time. We are also at a critical juncture in our journey. We must examine the strength of our foundation as a parish. We need to evaluate what has worked well, what needs to be improved, and what new concerns must be addressed in the next ten years. Several parish advisory groups are working on these questions.

One immediate need that we face is volunteerism. Some of the opportunities are familiar: ministers to bring communion to those not able to attend Mass, catechists to educate parishioners in the wonders of our faith, and liturgical ministers to bring vibrancy to our worship. Some opportunities might be newly created. The finance committee has formed some committees to help us in our stewardship of God's gifts. We will be expanding our livestream capabilities next month. There are a variety of parishioners and those in the community who may earnestly desire what our community of faith has to offer. We simply need to match those who can give with those who must receive.

I will be unfolding a more formal program of stewardship in the fall, with specific needs and skills being solicited. In the meantime, as I mentioned in my homily last week, sometimes as Church we spend too much time trying to fit offerings into pre-existent slots. Therefore, I am inviting parishioners to weigh in. Do you have a skill or passion that you desire to share, but do not know how it might fit in? Do you have a need or a concern that the Church might address, but is not currently? Have you experienced a ministry or outreach in another parish and wonder if there is interest at POTHE? Do you desire to meet with other parishioners in a similar life stage as you: new to area, young parent, newly bereaved, teen, or young adult, etc? Do you need more information about a ministry, what Adoration is, and other current offerings of the parish? Please let me or one of the staff know. Your participation and interest will help guide current discussions and assistance in parish surveys or information gathering to come.

GOSPEL BACKGROUND

In today's Gospel, we read the report of the return of the Twelve, who were sent by Jesus to preach repentance, heal the sick, and drive out demons. When the Twelve return to Jesus, He invites them to come away from the crowds and rest. But the crowds will not give them peace. As the Twelve have shared in Jesus' ministry, they now appear to share in His popularity. The crowds continue to approach them, and Mark reports that the disciples don't even have time to eat.

GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK 6: 30 - 34

The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught. He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them. When He disembarked and saw the vast crowd, His heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them many things.

FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Jesus knew that His disciples were tired, and He wanted to spend some quiet time with them. But they weren't able to do that on this day because the crowds kept following them. Jesus also wants to spend quiet time with us, and He invites us to do this in our prayer. Now that Jesus is with God in heaven, He is able to be with us whenever we pray. As we settle in at the end of the day, we can spend time with Jesus in prayer.

Each day we are busy doing many good and fun activities. At the end of the day, we are tired and need time to rest. What are some of the things you do at the end of the day to help you rest?
