HOW TO SEE AS FAITH-FILLED DISCIPLES



There is a great richness to the short story in this week's Gospel on the healing of Bartimaeus. We can explore why is he named by Mark, when many other healings do not offer the person's name. We can relate to the fickleness of the crowd, who first attempt to block him from Jesus. Only after Jesus acknowledges Bartimaeus do they help him to meet the Lord. We recognize that after the healing Bartimaeus leaves Jericho to follow Jesus as a disciple, in contrast to those who are healed who simply return to their old lives.

However, I wish to focus on the fact that Bartimaeus knows what he wants from Jesus. He wants to see. In the Scriptures, sight is always a physical reality and a spiritual one. He wants to be able to use his eyes to see the world around him, for sure. He also wants to see the world as God wants him to understand it, and so he is eager to follow Jesus. Do we really know what we want Jesus to do for us?

I suspect that many of us create lists of things that we ask of Jesus. Most of them are likely time sensitive: help me to do well in an activity today, heal a sick loved one, forgive me this sin, etc. Jesus certainly invites us to ask, seek and knock, so there is nothing "wrong" with these types of prayers. A steady diet of such prayer just keeps us moving from one need to another, training us to wait for Jesus to rescue us from a difficult situation. This is a form of spiritual blindness. We may have 20 / 20 vision physically, but we fail to see as God would have us see. We do not recognize how we can cooperate with God's Spirit to overcome a difficulty or to help another in need. We tend to see others as competitors instead of brothers and sisters in the Lord. We embrace faith for what it might bring us, instead of how it will help us to proclaim the presence of God and the Kingdom.

The failure to see can be caused by many factors: lack of light to see clearly, lack of or misdirected focus, and physical barriers, to name a few. When we stay in sin and the values of the world, we lack the light of Christ. When we are focused on ourselves, we are not looking at Christ. When we skip prayer and spiritual disciplines, we create barriers to experience the presence of God. What is it that we want from Jesus? Can it be that perhaps we are not seeing as clearly as we believe that we are? If so, take the time to ask God for the grace to see as we need to see as faith-filled disciples.

GOSPEL BACKGROUND

Today's Gospel offers us a powerful example of faith and persistence in prayer. Those around him rebuked Bartimaeus for his efforts to attract Jesus' attention. When silenced by the crowd, however, Bartimaeus called out all the more. He is persistent and bold in his confidence that Jesus will show mercy on him and do what he asks. His persistence and great confidence that Jesus would help him reminds us of the confidence with which our children bring to us their needs. In their faith and trust we can find an example of the attitude with which we might approach God in prayer.

GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK 10: 46-52

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with His disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed Him on the way.

FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

As a family, recall a request that has been made repeatedly by one family member to another. Talk about why the request continues to be made if the answer continues to be no. After reading the Gospel, pose questions such as these to your family: Why must Bartimaeus be persistent in calling out to Jesus? What does Bartimaeus do when some try to stop him?

November is the month when Catholics traditionally pray for their departed loved ones. We believe that our prayers and sacrifices on behalf of the dead in Purgatory can assist them in their purification. Such prayer also reminds us that our ultimate destination is Heaven, and that we should live lives that bring us closer to that reality.

As we did last year, envelopes for All Souls that are collected will be divided, and placed on the four church altars. During the month of November, at all Masses, the priest will be praying for the intentions of the names submitted for the entire parish, not simply the envelopes on that altar. 


