BE THE CATALYST FOR A LOVED ONE TO COME BACK TO THE CHURCH



This will be my final Pastor's Pondering for POTHE. Next week, Fr. Cartwright will be writing to introduce himself to the Parish before he arrives.

It is fitting that this week we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan. This marks the beginning of His public ministry. His relationship with His heavenly Father is placed on full display for the world to see and understand. Our Baptism begins our formation in the love of God and preparation for a lifetime of discipleship. During my time as pastor, I have attempted to highlight the importance of being intentional disciples.

Sometimes we are in the right place at the opportune time. We deflect a ball for the winning goal, we are able to help someone because we were nearby in their time of distress, and any number of similar events. The result is important, but we honestly realize that it just as easily might not have happened. Discipleship asks that we prepare ourselves. We take the time to learn what God's will is for us and His Church. We work to develop good habits of prayer, virtue, and charitable works. We dutifully examine our lives regularly to see where we have erred, what opportunities to serve we may have missed, and what we are doing well with God's help.

Living through a pandemic has certainly challenged our individual opportunities to interact with our brothers and sisters. Our capacity to offer educational and service programs in the parish has been limited. Still, I am heartened to see the many signs of dynamic faith in our parish. Several individuals have come back to the faith because of a child preparing for the sacraments, or the faith of a spouse. I was blessed to witness deep conversion experiences in the Sacrament of Reconciliation this year, especially this past Advent. Parishioners found creative ways to share faith with one another. Some have come forward to begin liturgical ministries, including young altar servers. Our generosity to those in need has reached near-record levels. The times that I have need to ask for someone to step up to help, the response has been there.

As more and more parishioners become comfortable, I pray that you will return to Mass, and the ministries you once offered. I invite those who have pondered getting involved to reach out to the staff. We are still shy to ask many directly, so we may not realize your interest or comfort level. Please share your stories of faith. Many have indicated how much they benefited from my weekly writings. You all have similar stories and insights to share, and you may be a catalyst for a loved one to come back to the Church, to deepen their knowledge of faith or to realize the abiding love that God has for them. I am grateful to have been your pastor for all too brief a time. I have learned how to be more intentional in my discipleship and leadership from you and will be bringing this to my new assignment with a grateful heart. May God bless you all fruitfully in the coming time.

Our Father...

GOSPEL BACKGROUND

The Baptism of Jesus is considered a manifestation of God in Jesus, another "epiphany." On this, the last day of the Christmas season, our Gospel reveals to us Jesus' relation to God: the son of Mary and Joseph is also God's own Son. In Luke's Gospel, all three members of the Trinity are manifested here: God the Father in the voice, the Holy Spirit descending, and Jesus the Son. At the beginning of his Gospel, Luke is communicating to us important information about the identity of Jesus. In the verses that follow, Luke lists the genealogy of Jesus, tracing Jesus' ancestry back to the first person, Adam, who is also identified as the son of God. We, the children of Adam and Eve, are again made children of God through Baptism.

LUKE 3: 15 - 16, 21 - 22

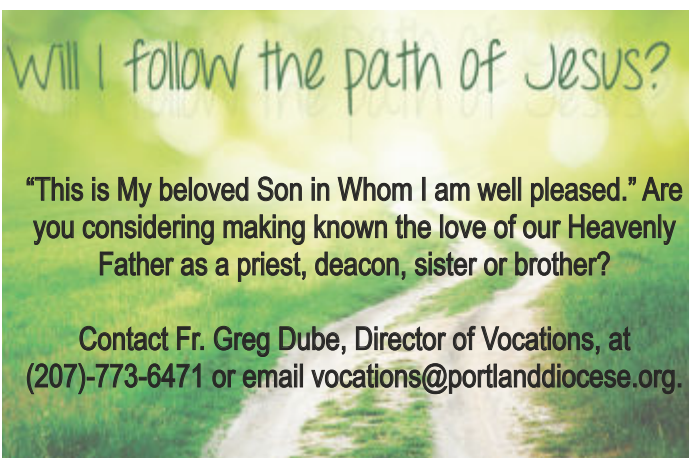
The people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of His sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."


After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with You I am well pleased."

FAMILY CONVERSATION

As you gather as a family, identify some of the expectations and behaviors that govern your family life by answering the question, "What are some of the things that make our family life unique?" Celebrate these things about your family life. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed His behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life?

A NOTE FROM OUR FINANCE COUNCIL

Fellow Parishioners,

I hope all have had a peaceful and blessed holiday season.

With the beginning of a new year, we are halfway through our fiscal year. Your parish Finance Committee continues to meet regularly and we want to keep you apprised of our current financial status.

We have a very generous parish and are doing well despite these trying times. Our offertory has been behind budget driven in large part by the continuing pandemic challenges. We have managed our expenses to levels below our budget but have not been able to fully offset the revenue shortfall. Like our many families, we are experiencing inflation in the costs we incur, such as heating oil, and this is placing some pressure on our expense levels. Lastly, we have been working to keep up with planned maintenance and improvements as well as unplanned items - boiler repairs were needed at both Sacred Heart and Holy Martyrs, chimney and deck repairs were done at St. Gregory, and St. Jude experienced some additional costs in their work to create greater accessibility.

January is often time for reviewing or revising financial items, and so the council wanted to offer a few reminders:

- Credit cards may often expire near the beginning of the year, so be sure to update your automatic payments.
- As you are reviewing your family budget for the year, be sure to take the time for a prayerful update to your planned giving.
- Setting up your offertory giving via We Share—our secure online giving portal—is the perfect way to ensure your weekly donations aren't impacted by attendance-limiting factors such as bad weather, pandemic restrictions, or travel.

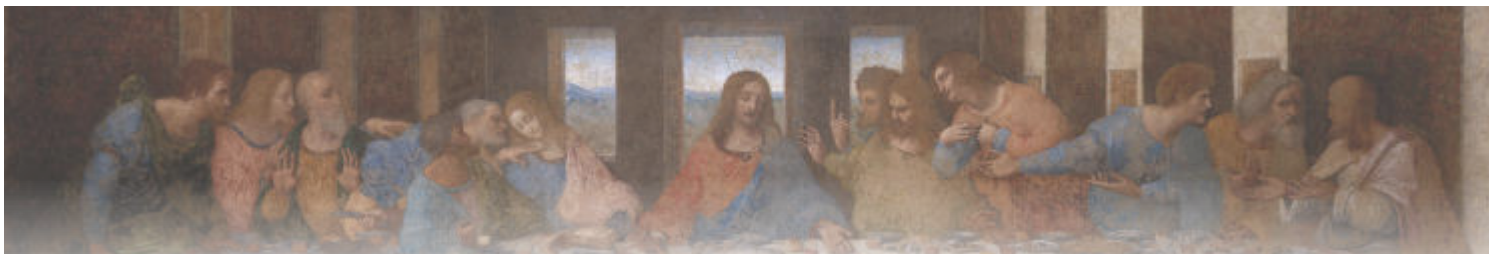

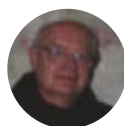
