

## WELCOME, FATHER CARTWRIGHT!

Dear Parishioners of Parish of the Holy Eucharist,

When I was 15 years old, I remember meeting then-Pastor and Director of Seminarians, Msgr. Charles Murphy at Holy Martyrs Church in Falmouth to begin discussing a possible call to the Holy Priesthood and the process to applying to the seminary. Fast forward twenty-seven years, and now, it is a great honor for me, for the Parish of the Holy Eucharist to be my first pastorate and to serve you as your Pastor. I would like to express my gratitude to your outgoing Pastor, Father Phil Tracy, for his ministry in the parish, and for his tremendous kindness during the transition process.

As I begin my ministry as Pastor, I would like to tell you about myself, I am 42 years old and have been a priest for almost 7 years. I am an only child, though I claim two stepsisters from living with a "host family" for my junior and senior year of high school while I was training for swimming. My dear father, Robert, died back in 2008 and my mother, Lynn, lives in assisted living in Portland, where I can be in proximity to her and to her needs and care.

I graduated from John Bapst Memorial High School in Bangor in 1997 and the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC with a degree in philosophy in 2001. Upon college graduation and leaving seminary the first time, I became the Head Swimming and Diving Coach at Georgetown University. I later reentered seminary formation in 2010.

I have attended seminaries and taken classes at Theological College of the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC (1999-2001), Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary in Wynnewood, PA (2010-2012), Saint John's Seminary in Brighton, MA (2012-2015), and graduated with a Master of Divinity from Pope Saint John XXIII Seminary in Weston, MA in 2015.

When it comes to recreation and hobbies, I still am an avid swimmer, I like being outdoors either on my bike or in my kayak, and I like to read. I also like spending some quiet time with my fish and my six-year-old English bulldog, Levi. I enjoy grinding a strong cup of coffee in the morning, and I am a devoted Edwin McCain, Hootie and the Blowfish, and Sister Hazel fan.

I find the name of our parish incredibly significant, Parish of the Holy Eucharist. Especially in these COVID times, and as people become more comfortable, finding our way physically back to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Most Holy Eucharist is paramount. As you know, the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our beautiful Catholic Faith. As Our Shepherd Bishop Deeley recently stated in his Pastoral Letter on the Eucharist:

"Just as Christ comes to us bodily and personally, so are we meant to be present to him in return, bodily and personally. This demands one's physical presence; a virtual presence is not the same. A virtual presence, by its nature, remains artificial. It is an electronic presence, not a human presence. A human presence demands flesh and blood. I need to be here in order to be with the other, especially the others whom I love. No one who loves is satisfied with being physically apart."

My dear friends, may we not be apart from each other and most especially from Our Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist. I look forward to meeting you in person in the coming weeks. In the meantime, so that you have it, my email address is steven.cartwright@portlanddiocese. org. I kindly ask for a place in your daily prayers and ask for your patience as well as I begin this transition.

### **GOSPEL BACKGROUND**

This Sunday we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. For many Sundays in this lectionary cycle (Cycle C), our readings will be taken from the Gospel of Luke. Occasionally, however, we will read from John's Gospel. This is true of today's Gospel reading, which describes the beginning of Jesus' ministry and His first miracle. In the Church's liturgical history, the wedding feast of Cana is closely associated with the Baptism of the Lord and the adoration of the infant Jesus by the Wise Men. In this context, the sign Jesus performs at the wedding feast is celebrated as an epiphany or a manifestation of Jesus' divinity.

### JOHN 2: 1 - 11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and His disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect Me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever He tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then He told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed His glory, and His disciples began to believe in Him.

### **FAMILY CONVERSATION**

If your family has attended a wedding celebration together, talk about the experience and the planning and cooperation that made the celebration memorable. Talk about how weddings and feasts are images of God's tremendous love for us and examples of how we can show our love for one another.


