### IMITATION OF CHRIST SERIES WITH FATHER DAN GREENLEAF

Fr. Daniel Greenleaf, pastor of the Lewiston parish, will lead Maine Catholics through The Imitation of Christ on Mondays; next Session is January 24. The sessions will be offered in person at the hall of Holy Family Church, located on 607 Sabattus Street in Lewiston, and virtually via Microsoft Teams on Monday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. from January 17 through February 28. For more information or to register, visit www.princeofpeace.me/imitation-of-christ. "Having it online allows seniors who do not want to go out at night to participate. Young families with children at home do not need a babysitter, and those who are fearful of COVID-19 do not miss out," said Fr. Greenleaf. "Those who want to be in person have that option, too."

The Imitation of Christ by Thomas à Kempis is a Christian devotional book first composed in Latin in the 15th century. It is a handbook for spiritual life arising from the Devotio Moderna movement, of which Kempis was a member, and regarded as a devotional and religious classic. Apart from the Bible, no book has been translated into more languages. The text is divided into four books, which provide detailed spiritual instructions: "Helpful Counsels of the Spiritual Life", "Directives for the Interior Life", "On Interior Consolation," and "On the Blessed Sacrament." The approach taken in the book is characterized by its emphasis on the interior life and withdrawal from the world and places a high level of emphasis on the devotion to the Eucharist as a key element of spiritual life.

Each week, the bulletin provides a summary of the readings and questions for reflection and on Mondays, those interested gather to discuss the week's assignment. A link to the parish Microsoft Teams account is provided for those who cannot gather but would still like to participate," said Fr. Greenleaf.

#### **LET US PRAY**

Our Father....

#### **GOSPEL BACKGROUND**

Today's Gospel reading combines two separate passages taken from the Gospel of Luke. First we hear the opening verses where Luke establishes the purpose of his Gospel. In chapter four, we hear that Jesus is in His hometown of Nazareth, attending the synagogue on the Sabbath, which is said to be His custom. In this account, we find another important clue that Jesus lived as a faithful, observant Jew. As Jesus stands in the synagogue, He reads from the scroll handed to Him; it contains the words of the prophet Isaiah. At this early moment in His ministry, Jesus announces His mission in continuity with Israel's prophetic tradition. This reading from Isaiah defines Jesus' ministry. Jesus' ministry will include bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, healing to the sick, freedom to the oppressed, and proclaiming a year acceptable to the Lord.

#### LUKE 1: 1 - 4, 4: 14 - 21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of Him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He came to Nazareth, where He had grown up, and went according to His custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me,
because He has anointed Me
to bring glad tidings to the poor.
He has sent Me to proclaim liberty to captives
and recovery of sight to the blind,
to let the oppressed go free,
and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.

Rolling up the scroll, He handed it back to the attendant and sat down,



## MORNING AND EVENING OF RECOLLECTION FOR WOMEN AND MEN


