DECEMBER 26, 2021

The True Light Has Come into the World, Shines in the Darkness, and the Darkness Did Not Overcome it.

The mystery of new life is a ponderous one. I think the marvel of enfolding a newborn in one's arms would leave us trembling with awe if we weren't also gingerly aware of the how delicate a thing it is to hold a human life. The possibilities of newness, of fresh beginnings, are bundled up with each infant. Who that person is, and the gifts (s)he brings into the world—personality, character, talents, outlook—everything that goes along with a unique individual is nestled into the baby, ready to unfold with the years, to blossom and develop as the person grows. It's no wonder the Blessed Mother treasured the shepherd's words and pondered them in her heart as she rocked the Baby Jesus.

I don't think I'm spoiling Christmas for anyone when I say that December 25th isn't actually Jesus's birthday. It's just the day we've designated to celebrate the fact that the Lord God Almighty was born as a human infant. The reason the date was chosen is that it's so close to the winter solstice, December 21st. Astronomically, daylight begin to increase in the northern hemisphere starting from that date; it's a fitting symbol for the light of the world—Christ Himself—extending His life in the world.

But it's also tied to the new year. Even decades before Jesus's birth, the western world celebrated the start of a new year on January 1st. Christ's entrance into the world inaugurates a new age, appropriately captured with the new year ushered in a week after we celebrate His birth. As we prepare for the fresh start that each new year represents for us, as we whet our appetites for new possibilities like we do each holiday season, it's always the echo of the true newness of life that gives these expectations their real force.

I've heard that there's not much hope being held out for this new year. We waited for 2020 to be over, but 2021 didn't offer any relief from the burden most people felt so oppressively. Now, apparently, very few people anticipate anything better from 2022. But when earthly hope dims, the glow of heavenly hope should radiate more vividly. Just as bright possibilities come alive with the mystery of newborn life, the nativity of our Savior carries the mystery of eternal life. It's the hope for the promise made by the Child's Name: Emmanuel—the hope that God is with us, even when the winter light seems so fleeting.

Wishing a blessed Christmas to you and those you love, a happy celebration of the Feast of the Holy Family, and a hope-filled New Year.

O mistério da nova vida é pesado. Eu acho que a maravilha de envolver um recém-nascido nos braços nos deixaria tremendo de admiração se não estivéssemos também cautelosamente conscientes de como é delicado segurar uma vida humana. As possibilidades de novidades, de novos começos, são empacotadas com cada criança. Quem é essa pessoa, e os dons que ela traz ao mundo - personalidade, caráter, talentos, perspectiva - tudo o que vem junto com um indivíduo único está aninhado no bebê, pronto para envolver com os anos, para florescer e se desenvolver conforme a pessoa cresce. Não é de admirar que a Mãe Santíssima valorizasse as palavras do pastor e as ponderasse em seu coração enquanto embalava o Menino Jesus.

Não acho que estou estragando o Natal quando digo que 25 de dezembro não é realmente o aniversário de Jesus. É apenas o dia que designamos para celebrar o fato de que o Senhor Deus Todo-Poderoso nasceu como uma criança humana. A razão pela qual a data foi escolhida é que está muito perto do solstício de inverno, 21 de dezembro. Astronomicamente, a luz do dia começa a aumentar no hemisfério norte a partir dessa data; é um símbolo adequado para a luz do mundo - o próprio Cristo - estendendo Sua vida no mundo.

Mas também está vinculado ao ano novo. Mesmo décadas antes do nascimento de Jesus, o mundo ocidental comemorou o início de um novo ano em 1º de janeiro. A entrada de Cristo no mundo inaugura uma nova era, apropriadamente capturada com o ano novo inaugurado uma semana após celebrarmos Seu nascimento. Enquanto nos preparamos para o recomeço que cada novo ano representa para nós, enquanto abrimos nosso apetite por novas possibilidades como fazemos em cada temporada de férias, é sempre o eco da verdadeira novidade de vida que dá a essas expectativas sua verdadeira força.

Ouvi dizer que não há muita esperança para este novo ano. Esperava-mos que 2020 acabassem bem, mas 2021 não ofereceu nenhum alívio para o fardo que a maioria das pessoas sentiam de forma opressiva. Agora, aparentemente, muito poucas pessoas antecipam algo melhor a partir de 2022. Mas quando a esperança terrena esmaece, o brilho da esperança celestial deve irradiar mais vividamente. Assim como as possibilidades brilhantes ganham vida com o mistério da vida recém-nascida, o nascimento de nosso Salvador carrega o mistério da vida eterna.
