# Reform, Renewal, and Repentance (Part II) . . .

The Great Western Schism. The year is 1378. In April, the College of Cardinals elected as the Successor of Peter a bishop of impeccable character, who took the name Urban VI. However, his high moral standards made him a severe pontiff, and the common opinion—both at the time, and that of history—is that the sudden assumption of such power put too great a strain on his nerves. Five months after Urban VI's election, the Cardinals met again and elected a rival pope, who took the name Clement VII and established his headquarters in Avignon, France—where most of the popes of the previous seventy-five years had lived. Two men claiming the papacy, one in Rome, the other in France. Both elected by the same College of Cardinals. *Will the real Vicar of Christ please stand up?* 

The Church as a whole—the People of God—was divided down party lines. Urban VI excommunicated Clement VII; Clement VII excommunicated Urban VI. Each pope created more cardinals from bishops in their own faction to make up the numbers of those "heretical" cardinals who sided with the other camp. In 1389 Urban VI died, and Boniface IX succeeded him in Rome. Five years later, in 1394, Clement VII died, and Benedict XIII succeeded him in Avignon. (Both of these Avignon-popes have since been pronounced anti-popes by history, so their names are not included in the list of authentic Successors of Peter.) But by now the only thing that is at all clear is that the whole thing is just a tangled mess.

In 1409 a Council was convened in Pisa, at which both lines of popes were "deposed" and a new pontiff elected, who took the name John XXIII. However, neither Gregory XII (who by this time was the sitting pope in Rome) nor Benedict XIII acknowledged John, and so all the council accomplished was to throw a third rival into the mix!

Finally, at the Council of Constance in 1414, the slate was wiped clean. All three factions were put to rest, as first the anti-pope John was deposed, then Gregory resigned, and at last Benedict was unseated. The council elected Otto Colonna, who took the name Martin V, starting a new line of popes altogether, and in an effort to avoid such bedlam in the future, the bishops at Constance called for ecumenical councils to be held at frequent intervals.

However, the need for reform was made embarrassingly clear by the Western Schism, and sadly, even frequent councils could not sufficiently address the need . . .

# Reforma, Renovação e Arrependimento (Parte II) ...

O Grande Cisma Ocidental. O ano é 1378. Em abril, o Colégio dos Cardeais elegeu como Sucessor de Pedro um bispo de caráter impecável, que tomou o nome de Urbano VI. No entanto, seus altos padrões morais fizeram dele um pontífice severo, e a opinião comum - tanto na época quanto na história - é que a súbita ascensão de tal poder colocou uma pressão muito grande em seus nervos. Cinco meses após a eleição de Urbano VI, os cardeais se reuniram novamente e elegeram um papa rival, que adotou o nome de Clemente VII e estabeleceu sua sede em Avignon, na França – onde a maioria dos papas dos setenta e cinco anos anteriores haviam vivido. Dois homens reivindicando o papado, um em Roma, o outro na França. Ambos eleitos pelo mesmo Colégio de Cardeais. O verdadeiro Vigário de Cristo, por favor, se levantará?

A Igreja como um todo – o Povo de Deus – estava dividida em linhas partidárias. Urbano VI excomungou Clemente VII; Clemente VII excomungou Urbano VI. Cada papa criou mais cardeais de bispos da sua própria facção para compor o número daqueles cardeais "heréticos" que ficaram do outro lado do campo. Em 1389 Urbano VI morreu, e Bonifácio IX o sucedeu em Roma. Cinco anos depois, em 1394, Clemente VII morreu e Bento XIII o sucedeu em Avignon. (Ambos esses papas de Avinhão foram desde então declarados antipapas pela história, então seus nomes não estão incluídos na lista de autênticos sucessores de Pedro.) Mas agora a única coisa que está clara é que todo isto é apenas uma confusão emaranhada.

Em 1409, um Concílio foi convocado em Pisa, no qual ambas as linhas de papas foram "depostas" e um novo pontífice eleito, que assumiu o nome de João XXIII. No entanto, nem Gregório XII (que nessa época era o papa em exercício em Roma) nem Bento XIII reconheceram João, e então tudo o que o concílio realizou foi lançar um terceiro rival na mistura!

Finalmente, no Concílio de Constança em 1414, a lousa foi limpa. Todas as três facções foram postas de lado, pois primeiro o antipapa João foi deposto, depois Gregório renunciou e, finalmente, Bento foi destituído. O concílio elegeu Otto Colonna, que adotou o nome de Martinho V, iniciando uma nova linha de papas e, em um esforço para evitar tal confusão no futuro, os bispos de Constança pediram que concílios ecumênicos fossem realizados em intervalos frequentes.
