

Reflection for April 6th
the 5th Sunday of Lent

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today, we reflect on one of the most powerful encounters of Jesus' mercy in the Gospel—His meeting with the woman caught in adultery. This passage from John 8:1-11 is not only a lesson on divine forgiveness but also a challenge to examine our own hearts and attitudes toward others. The scene unfolds with the scribes and Pharisees bringing a woman before Jesus, claiming she was caught in the act of adultery. They remind Jesus that the Law of Moses demands her execution. But their real intent is not justice; they seek to trap Jesus, to force Him into a dilemma—either uphold the Law and contradict His message of mercy, or show mercy and seemingly reject the Law. Jesus does something unexpected. He bends down and writes on the ground with His finger. What did He write? Scripture does not tell us, but perhaps He was listing the hidden sins of those who accused her. Or perhaps He was drawing attention away from their condemnation, inviting them to reflect. Then He stands and speaks the words that have echoed through history: "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone." Silence follows. One by one, the accusers drop their stones and walk away. None of them can claim sinlessness. At last, only Jesus and the woman remain. She, the one condemned by others, now stands before the only One who has the right to judge her. And what does He say? "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." Here, dear brothers and sisters, we see the heart of Christ's mission. He does not deny sin. He does not dismiss the need for change. But He does something greater—He offers mercy and calls the sinner to conversion. Beware of the spirit of condemnation. The scribes and Pharisees were eager to expose another's sin while ignoring their own. How often do we do the same? Before we judge, we must remember our own need for God's mercy. Jesus is ready to forgive. No sin is too great for His mercy. The woman expected judgment but found grace. How often do we doubt God's mercy in our own lives? When we fall, do we return to Him with trust? True mercy calls for transformation. Jesus does not excuse the woman's sin; He calls her to leave it behind. Mercy is not permission to continue in sin but an invitation to new life. Today, as we stand before the Lord, let us ask ourselves: Are we quick to judge others while ignoring our own faults? Do we truly believe in Christ's mercy for ourselves and for those we struggle to forgive? Jesus tells us, just as He told the woman, "Neither do I condemn you." But He also calls us to "Go and sin no more." May we receive His mercy, extend it to others, and walk in the newness of life He offers.
