Dear parishioners,

In early 2020, plans for the “Year of the Eucharist” were unveiled throughout the Archdiocese. When the pandemic hit, most parishes had to put their plans on hold. Sacred Hearts is pleased to announce that its Year of the Eucharist Committee has been hard at work over the past several weeks developing plans to bring this important observance back!

The Archdiocese created the Year of the Eucharist as a way to elevate this “Most Blessed Sacrament” in the hearts and minds of the faithful. We receive this sacrament every week, but many of us likely don’t always stop to reflect upon what we are actually seeing, touching, tasting. We call it the most blessed of all the sacraments because of what it is. It may look like a wafer and some wine, but it only looks that way. In reality, when we gaze upon these elements, we are looking at Jesus himself, body and blood, soul and divinity. In all of the sacraments, Jesus is active and at work, but only in the Eucharist is Jesus literally, physically present in his very body.

We humans were created for intimate relationship with God. Through sin, we are separated from God, and this is the cause of unhappiness, all discomfort. God did not create us for unhappiness; he created us for immense joy, which we only attain by allowing him to fill every void within us. Too lost to find our way to him on our own, he came to us on a divine rescue mission. Because we are physical beings who see through physical eyes, he took on literal flesh so that we could see and feel him. Before his death, Jesus celebrated the Last Supper, telling us he would be with us always, nourishing us with his body and blood. In the Eucharist, we escape all earthly time and enter into the one, eternal event of the Lord’s sacrifice and Heavenly banquet table. At this table, he is truly present to us. All of Heaven is present to us. When we accept his invitation to dine at his banquet table, we are dining alongside everyone who has ever lived, everyone we have ever loved, who has also partaken. At this table, we find a foretaste of the Heavenly home for which we were meant. “Taste and see that the Lord is good!”

This beautiful theology should be celebrated and proclaimed as our greatest gift and our greatest victory as Catholics. The Year of the Eucharist Committee is endeavoring to do at least one special thing per month to do so:

OCTOBER: This letter re-introducing the Year of the Eucharist to the parish

NOVEMBER: Two weekends will feature members of the parish speaking after the homily about the power and beauty of the Eucharist in their lives.

DECEMBER: We will have a holy hour on Sunday afternoon, December 12th, from 12:30 p.m. - 1:30 p.m.

JANUARY: Dr. Elizabeth Woodard, pastoral associate, will be presenting two assemblies on the Eucharist to the children at Sacred Hearts School.

FEBRUARY: Watch for homilies tying this month’s readings into the beautiful theology of the Eucharist.

Readings on the Sundays of this month are rich with imagery about food and metaphors about how to embody the Spirit of God: catching fish, fruit-bearing trees, and the Beatitudes’ reference to the hungry and thirsty.

MARCH: We will host a three-evening Eucharist retreat on March 13th, 14th, and 15th from 7:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.

APRIL: Holy Thursday falls on April 14th and begins our celebration of the Paschal Triduum in which Jesus instituted the Eucharist - the first Mass.

MAY: Our second-graders will receive their First Holy Communion

JUNE: We will mark the conclusion of the Year of the Eucharist with a grand Corpus Christi Procession

The word “Eucharist” means “Thanksgiving.” Please join us in a wonderful year of giving thanks for God’s most precious gift to us - himself.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTRY

As we celebrate the Year of the Eucharist, we invite those interested in becoming an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist to pray about this calling. DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that **Eucharistic Adoration** is a practice of the Catholic Church where worship of the Eucharist (the Sacramental body of Christ) is extended beyond the Mass? During the time of adoration, a large consecrated host is placed inside a circular, clear glass receptacle known as a **luna** which is then inserted in the center of a **monstrance**. The monstrance, a vessel often with a "sunburst" design, then rests on the center of the altar with candles burning at either side. This allows the faithful to see the Blessed Sacrament as they pray in Christ's powerful presence. The night before His death, as Jesus was suffering His lonely agony in the garden, His disciples were dozing. He returned to them and asked, "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?" (Mt. 26:40). He also asks us to take time from our busy lives to spend some time in His company; Eucharistic Adoration can be that perfect opportunity. At Sacred Hearts Church, adoration is held weekly on Fridays after the 7:00 a.m. Mass until 11:00 a.m. in the lower Immaculate Heart of Mary Chapel.
