

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you. Jeremiah 1:5

Dear fellow parishioners,

Isaiah saw a vision in the year of King Uzziah's death and lived 700 years before the birth of Jesus. He was born in Jerusalem and became a prophet with a passionate zeal foretelling the coming Messiah Jesus Christ. As a Hebrew prophet of the Old Testament, he is revered in both Judaism and Christianity.

Isaiah spoke life, life in the burdened children of Israel and life in the troubled souls of the marginalized. In this politically charged world, he would have been recognized as an advocate for social justice, truth and equity.

With exquisite allegory, today's first reading provides insight into the mind and soul of a prophet especially chosen by God to advance His Will. Isaiah had extraordinary insight into God's desires for the people of Israel who were chosen to demonstrate His desire for eventual redemption and alignment. There is no religion in the world where a "god" pursues those who worship it. But Isaiah understood that the true God would affect an intervention – and the evidence of His grace - would be Jesus Christ in order to fulfill His pursuit of us!

Isaiah not only understood a nominal level of God's mind but also understood the very nature of man. Individually and collectively as a Church we have the opportunity to serve others. In today's first reading there are words of solace to give hope to those trapped by darkness.

He is directly speaking to all of us.

May this riveting scripture motivate us by lifting others. May it be a call to mimic Jesus and be a calming force in the lives of others who are experiencing storms.

It would be folly to refrain from such actions until we are no longer in a broken state.

We will never dislodge our brokenness fully.

Therefore, strike out boldly as Isaiah guides us so that we can lift ourselves too and secure a glimpse of God's grace.

#### Did You Know?

Did you know that after this year's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord on January 9th, our liturgical season changes to Ordinary Time? This season is "ordinary" in the sense that the weeks are "ordered," or **numbered**. The Church's liturgical new year began with the First Sunday of Advent, has continued through Christmastime, and now moves to the First Week in Ordinary Time on January 10th. In the middle of the Eighth week of Ordinary Time, Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, and the season of Lent arrive, so Ordinary Time will take a lengthy break to allow for the seasons of both Lent and Eastertime. The ordering of the weeks will continue again on June 6th, the day after Pentecost. We will enjoy Ordinary Time from that point until Advent ushers in the new liturgical year after the Thirty-fourth Week. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green which is symbolic of growth/vitality and hope. Catholics can use these long weeks of Ordinary Time and its Gospel readings to grow in their spiritual life and relationship with the Lord as they reflect with hope on the mysteries of our faith revealed by both the teaching and actions of Christ.






