Dear Friends,

We are many parts, but we are all one body.

Have you ever looked at someone else with envy? I certainly have. What if my appearance, my skill set, my luck, were more like that of *that* person over there? Would I be happier? Healthier? More able to live out my calling? These thoughts are part of the human condition. It's innate to want to be our best selves. Often we confuse being the best version of our own selves with being better than others. If we're not better than others, we reason, then what do they get to enjoy that we miss out on?

Conversely, sometimes our spirituality isn't based on the holiness of God, but on just making sure we don't sin as badly as someone else we might know. "Sure, I may have lied," we may reason, "but at least I didn't kill, like that person over there." Comparison robs us of true joy and of true holiness.

St. Paul knew well the danger of comparison and this week's second reading encapsulates much of the wisdom of St. Paul in this regard. The longer form of the second reading, 1 Corinthians 12:12-30, has the option of being shortened to simply verses 12-14 and 27. The long form has some beautiful logic pertaining to the pitfall of comparison. St. Paul wonders what would happen if an eye tried to be an ear, or a foot, a hand: "If a foot should say, 'Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body,' it does not for this reason belong any less to the body." or, "If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended."

What if we truly embraced the idea that each of us exists in the body of Christ *as he intended*? What if you or I are not lacking in any good because we are not like some good person we know? What if we are exactly as we should be? This is not to say that any of us is perfect. All of us are impaired by the reality of sin. But it is essential that each of us aims to overcome the sin that manifests in us, and seeks to live out our own uniqueness. We hold up the saints as models of holiness, but of course, your holiness and mine will not look exactly like any one particular saint's.

We are not uniform. But we are united. Just like a body, says St. Paul, "if one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it. If one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." This is why so much of our call to holiness rests on serving the suffering. We cannot separate ourselves from the plight of others, and a community is only ever doing as well as its least successful member. This is why the heart of the Gospel, as we hear Jesus quoting the beginning of the 61st chapter of Isaiah this week, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed be free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

As we begin this year, may it be a year acceptable to the Lord, a year in which all of us aims to be our best, and all of us aims to lift up the lowly and hurting members of our body.



Did You Know?

Did you know on January 25th the Church will celebrate the feast of The Conversion of Saint Paul the Apostle? St. Paul's conversion to faith in Christ occurred through an encounter on the road to Damascus where he was traveling in search of Christians to persecute. Encountering a bright light and the voice of Christ, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5), Paul was blinded and fell to the ground, understanding in those moments the truth of who Jesus Christ is. Certainly, most Catholics/Christians will never experience a dramatic conversion similar to Paul's, but the Church teaches us that we all are called to conversion as a life -long process – a continual turning of our hearts to God and away from sin. In His teaching, Jesus linked conversion and repentance closely together, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent, and believe in the gospel." (Mk 1:15) The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us, "Jesus' call to conversion and penance" aims at the "conversion of the heart, interior conversion." (Para. 1430) ... Food for thought as Lent approaches in a few short weeks.


