

Dear Friends,

Today's readings remind me how sometimes it can be difficult to be a person of faith. In the first reading, God tells Jeremiah to stand firm as he shares God's words with the Israelites, even when they reject him and the messages coming directly from God. In the Gospel, Jesus is driven from his hometown of Nazareth when the crowd becomes angry because Jesus not so subtlety calls the residents out for a lack of faith. Jesus tells the truth, and then is rejected by the people who watched him grow up.

How many times in our lives have we agonized over things when our conscience tells us to do one thing, but societal pressure pushes us in another direction? Maybe it is something simple, like laughing at an improper joke when we should be cringing. Or maybe we have witnessed something more serious and have had to choose between intervention and just turning our back. Doing the right thing can cause a rift in friendships or could somehow endanger us.

In a time when "illegal immigrants" are vilified by many, our Christian calling should be to welcome them to a life of safety and abundance. When the homeless are pushed from view because they make the community look bad, do we take action to help, or join in the chorus telling them to "get a job!"? When the call goes out to help the hungry at our food pantry, do you make a cash or food donation, or do you take a more active approach and physically serve? Would you intervene if you saw someone being harassed by others?

It can be uncomfortable for us to see injustice, knowing that Jesus wants us to do the right thing, but also knowing it can be hard to do so. Will my friends think poorly of me? Maybe someone else will say something... I don't want to get involved...

Being uncomfortable can be a good thing because it can force us to change things. Maybe that is why our second

reading centers on LOVE? Perhaps we need to remember what Paul tells us as we choose between publicly living our faith, and quietly doing nothing - "...Faith, Hope, and Love remain, these three, but the greatest of these is love."

Jesus gives us love; how we share it is up to us. Maybe we are being called to respond to those hard issues of faith and Christianity. Be brave! Let everyone see Christ in you!

THE YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST CONTINUES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BOSTON AND IN SACRED HEARTS PARISH

During the Fall and early Winter, we heard testimonies from parishioners about the power of the Eucharist in their own lives, we experienced an Advent Holy Hour, and Dr. Elizabeth Woodard made two presentations to the children at Sacred Hearts School (one for grades 1-4 and another for grades 5-8) entitled "Everything You May Have Always Wondered About the Eucharist." The children had some great questions at those assemblies!

During the month of February, Fathers John, Dan, and Richard will lean heavily on the topic of the Eucharist in their homilies. On February 6th, we will hear the story about Simon catching so many fish that his nets almost burst (Luke 5:1-11). Jesus makes Himself known in the ordinary food of the people. Just as Peter looked with awe upon the impossibly great number of fish, so, too, our eyes should behold with wonder the mystery that is the infinite Lord of the Universe present in bread. Whether at Mass or in the sacrament of adoration (which takes place from 7:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. every Friday in the chapel at Sacred Hearts Church!), to behold the Eucharist is to behold eternity itself, to behold infinity itself, to behold God Himself. On February 13th, we will hear in the Beatitudes, "Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied." (Luke 7: 21). Jesus is the food that will leave us never hungry again, the drink of infinite quenching. On February 20th, we will hear about Jesus' command to love our enemies and to give double to anyone who takes from us (Luke 6:27-38). This echoes the infinity introduced in the story of the fish and the nets two weeks prior. And on February 27th, we will hear Jesus compare humans to trees, noting that trees are known by their fruits (Luke 6:29-45). Can you and I eat, and therefore also bear, the fruit that is Christ Himself? Can we become a truly Eucharistic people, bearing the fruit of goodness, love, and piety, because we water and till the soil of our hearts with nothing less than the bread of the angels? Please listen for these themes throughout February and reflect on the ways that you might allow the Eucharist to have a deeper power in your life.

Did You Know?

Did you know that St. Blaise, whose feast day is February 3rd, is the patron saint of those suffering from ailments of the throat? He was a late 3rd/early 4th century Christian in Armenia who began as a healer of both humans and animals, eventually



becoming a "physician of souls," and living a life of prayer in a cave among the wild animals. Later, as a Bishop, he was arrested for being a Christian. On his way to jail a woman approached him laying at his feet her only son who was choking to death on a fish bone; St. Blaise cured the child. Another story is that a woman implored his help when a wolf was attacking her pig, and at Blaise's command the wolf let the pig go. In gratitude, the woman brought two candles to him in jail so that he would have light to read the scriptures. It is said St. Blaise performed many other miracles before his martyrdom around the year 316 A.D. Today, many parishes commemorate his feast day with the blessing of throats using two crossed candles.
